BIENNIAL REVIEW

- Required under the Wildlife Conservation Act (17.2.37 – 17.2.46 NMSA 1978)
- Gather most current research data on state listed threatened and endangered species
- Reassess current status of state listed species
- Make recommendations on whether or not to change a species' listing status

Recommendation to Uplist Narrow-headed Gartersnake from Threatened to Endangered:

- Habitat specialist: shallow, swift-flowing streams of the San Francisco and Gila River drainages.
- Extirpated from a variety of sites, including two of the most robust populations.
- Surveys since 2017 have detected the species at only 7 of 17 known historical localities,
- Post-fire flooding likely led to the extirpation of the most important sites in New Mexico.

BIENNIAL REVIEW

- Process and public involvement:
 - > 90 day comment period, March 27 June 26
 - > Draft presented, August 13 Commission meeting
 - > 28 day comment period, August 13 September 10
 - > Final adoption, October 16 Commission meeting
- Final breakdown of Threatened and Endangered species
