

# Special Trout Water - Rio Chama

- ~ 3.5 mile reach below Cooper's Landing
- Catch and Release, Artificial Fly or Lure only





#### Gila Trout Rules

- Two fish limit, any tackle, for Mineral Creek and Whitewater Creek
- Expand Free Gila Trout Permit to all recovery and recreational waters open to angling
- Open Upper West Fork Gila River to angling, maintain closures for all tributaries
- Clarify South Diamond Creek closure



#### Introduction

Gila Trout (*Oncorhynchus gilae*) is native to the Gila, San Francisco, and Verde River Basins in New Mexico and Arizona; however it is now restricted to only small first- to third-order streams in the Gila and San Francisco drainages. Primary threats to Gila Trout include introduction of nonnative salmonids resulting in competition, predation, and hybridization; habitat degradation






### **Trout and Catfish**

  - Corrales Community Pond
  - Dennis Chavez Pond
  - Grants Riverwalk Pond





#### **Kokanee Waters**

- Open Pine River (near Navajo Reservoir) to snagging
- Close buoyed "no wake" areas at Pine and Sims boat ramps during spawning operations






# Public Responses to Amendments

  - Three in support
- Gila Trout Amendments
  - Four in support, FWS biologist concerns
- Rio Chama STW
  - Public meeting 17 in support, 17 opposed
  - Written comments 15 in support, 5 opposed
  - Rio Arriba Board of County Commissioners Resolution
