Rule Development Timeline

- July, August, October present at SGC meetings
- July Initial NMDGF proposals posted on the website
- August- Final NMDGF proposed rule posted on the website
- October Act on rule



Regulation and Enforcement

- Harvest only for abundant populations
- Season length establishes a limited window for harvest
- License and reporting requirements
- Director can set bag limits if need arises
- State legislation eliminated trapping on public land effective April 2022



Statewide Bobcat Harvest







Swift Fox Monitoring





- Non-invasive genetic sampling (scat) in northeast NM to assess population density, 2020
 - 113 sites monitored for 8 weeks

Swift Fox Monitoring

- 454/463 samples had sufficient DNA
 - 98% were swift fox, and 87% of those could be assigned to an individual
- 292 detections of 58 individuals (28F:30M)
- Preliminary results show densities of ~9 (6.5-13.2) swift fox per 100km²
 - Similar to previous estimates
