Law Enforcement

- Conservation Officers from across the state made several great cases this year that involved the illegal taking of our wildlife resource.
- Conservation Officers had 68,582 hunter, angler and trapper checks in 2018
- Conservation Officers served 44 search warrants and 49 arrest warrants
- Conservation Officers spent 47,145 hours patrolling in the field









Law Enforcement

- Field Operations performed 196 Special Operations in 2018
- 76 Artificial wildlife operations
- 45 Roadblocks were used across the state

Operation Game Thief

- In 2018 we received 177 Operation Game Thief (OGT) reports.
- 53 crimes were discovered because of those OGT reports
- When a crime is discovered the conviction rate is over 80%





Public Safety

- Conservation Officers assisted the New Mexico State Police during the two most recent snow storms.
- Conservation Officers rescued numerous motorists that had been stranded in the snow and ice on Interstate 40 for over eight hours in single digit temperatures.

NM CHAT is:

- · a conservation information system for energy development planners, natural resources managers, and conservation practitioners.
- a tool to better incorporate wildlife values, sensitive animals and plants, and important ecosystem features into land use decision-making to reduce conflicts and surprises.
- a collaborative project between the New Mexico Department of Game & Fish, Natural Heritage New Mexico at the University of New Mexico, and the Western Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies.

Use NM CHAT to quickly identify the location of New Mexico's crucial wildlife habitat



NM CHAT provides:

- landscape-level information on species and habitats.
- a Crucial Habitat Rank at a square-mile scale based on:
 Species of Concern (animals and plants)
 - Wildlife Corridors

 - Aquatic Species of Economic and Recreational Importance
 - Freshwater Integrity (watershed status)
 - Wetland and Riparian Areas
