

Background

Regulated Shooting Preserve Act Sections 17-3-35 through 17-3-42, NMSA 1978

 The state game commission may issue licenses authorizing the establishment and operation of regulated propagated game bird shooting preserves on private lands when in the judgment of the commission such areas will not conflict with any reasonable prior interest.

 - Pheasant
 - Bobwhite Quail

- ☐ Game species that occur naturally on the property:
 - Mule Deer
 - Pronghorn
 - Quail
 - Dove



Diamond Tail Shooting Preserve

- The Diamond Tail Shooting Preserve is located West of Melrose in Roosevelt County, New Mexico.
- The owner has made numerous improvements for the benefit of wildlife through habitat development.
- The proposed shooting preserve would consist of approximately 322 contiguous deeded acres.






Diamond Tail Shooting Preserve

- Conservation officers have inspected and found the property to be in suitable temporary holding habitat for propagated game birds.
- This shooting preserve, if approved, would provide increased hunter opportunity to State Trust Land surrounding the preserve
