Background

Regulated Shooting Preserve Act Sections 17-3-35 through 17-3-42, NMSA 1978

 The State Game Commission may issue licenses authorizing the establishment and operation of regulated propagated game bird shooting preserves on private lands when in the judgment of the commission, such areas will not conflict with any reasonable prior interest.



Strickling Ranch Shooting Preserve

- Owner Ben Strickling plans on releasing propagated:
 - Pheasants
 - Chukar
 - Bobwhite Quail
- Game species that occur naturally on the property
 - Bear, Mule Deer, Dove,
 Turkey, and Cougar.





Strickling Ranch Shooting Preserve


- Strickling ranch Shooting
 Preserve is located 1 ½ miles
 from Rowe, NM in San
 Miguel county.
- The proposed shooting preserve would consist of approximately 5,204 contiguous deeded acres.

- Conservation Officers
 have inspected and found
 the property to be
 suitable temporary
 holding habitat for
 propagated game birds.
- No adjoining landowners contacted expressed any objection to the shooting preserve.
