

STATE WILDLIFE COMMISSION MEETING AND RULE MAKING NOTICE

The New Mexico State Wildlife Commission (“Commission”) will be hosting a meeting and rule hearing on Friday, August 21, 2026 beginning at 9:00 a.m. at New Mexico Highlands University Student Center, 800 National Ave., Las Vegas, NM 87701. The purpose of this meeting is to hear and consider action as appropriate on the proposed changes to the: 1) Bighorn Sheep Rule; 2) Pronghorn Antelope Rule; 3) Deer Rule; and 4) Elk Rule.

Synopsis:

Bighorn Sheep Rule

The proposal is to amend the Bighorn Sheep Rule 19.31.17 NMAC which will become effective April 1, 2027. The most recent version of the rule will expire on March 31, 2027. Proposed changes include:

- 1) The Department reestablished a population of Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep in the Manzano mountains (Game Management Units [GMUs] 14 and 18) in the late 1970s. GMUs 14 and 18 have been included in the Bighorn Rule in the past however, new GPS collar data indicates this population primarily occupies private property year-round. To provide a mechanism for authorizing Rocky Mountain bighorn hunting in GMUs 14 and 18, the Department recommends adding these units as “open GMUs or areas” under the private land provisions of the rule. This change would allow for private land hunting opportunities, with dates jointly established for license years 2027-2028 through 2030-2031. The Department has a hunting agreement where 50% of the licenses would be allocated through the public draw and 50% would be provided to the participating landowner.
 - a. The Department will establish two hunt periods for the Manzanos: October 1-15 (Period 1) and October 16-30 (Period 2). We anticipate the first hunt being in 2027. The first hunter on the Manzanos will be a public draw hunter.
 - b. The Department will increase the bag limit for Rocky Mountain ram tags to better reflect bighorn abundance across a greater number GMUs, including the Manzanos.
- 2) The Department reestablished a population of desert bighorn sheep in the Sacramento mountains (GMU 34) in 2018. The initial reintroduction and subsequent translocations have resulted in older age class rams available for harvest. The Department will open GMU 34 with one hunt period: December 1-15.
- 3) In response to public comments, the Department will shift the hunt periods for the Little Hatchets and Big Hatchets desert bighorn hunts from September and October, to December. Both hunt areas would have two concurrent hunt periods from December 1-15 and December 16-30.
- 3) The Department will make adjustments to season dates in some areas. For example, if a hunt normally starts on a Saturday, this date shift would be maintained throughout the rule so the hunts continue to start on Saturday or adjusting to calendar starts for consistency.
- 4) Require the purchase of a license at least one day prior to hunting.

Pronghorn Antelope Rule

The proposal is to amend the Pronghorn Antelope Rule 19.31.15 NMAC which will become effective April 1, 2027. The most recent version of the rule will expire on March 31, 2027. Proposed changes include:

- 1) Require the purchase of a license at least one day prior to hunting. For hunts where published season dates are less than 6 days, hunters will no longer be able to buy a license once the hunt starts.
- 2) Implement a ranch registration process for purchase of private land OTC pronghorn licenses, similar to the current registration process used for private land elk licenses in Secondary management zones.
- 3) Implement a cap on private land OTC licenses and consider a more even distribution in hunts, similar to the public draw. If license distribution within a GMU is disproportionately skewed toward a particular hunt due to private land sales patterns, licenses will be redistributed to reduce that skew, though not necessarily distributed equally across all hunts. See table in Appendix 1 for details.
- 4) Shift GMU 4/50/52 rifle hunt to muzzleloader hunt
- 5) Adjust season dates where necessary. For example, shifting start dates to maintain hunts

beginning on Saturday or adjusting calendar day starts for consistency.

6) Based on discussions with McGregor and White Sands Missile Range (WSMR) staff, we recommended the following:

- a. McGregor: Decrease from 2 hunts of 7 licenses down to 2 hunts of 2 licenses
- b. WSMR: Decrease from 1 hunt of 5 down to 1 hunt of 3, and adjusting the bag limit from

ES to MB

7) Include GMU 48 alongside GMU 47 to allow hunters to access both GMUs during their draw hunt. Licenses will remain the same.

8) Similar to bighorn sheep and ibex, shift all F-IM license numbers to be “up to,” allowing the Department to adjust draw licenses up or down depending on population surveys.

9) Decrease license numbers in GMUs 41, 47, 56, 57, 58, and 59 to match current hunting levels. Specifically, the 20% license reduction implemented in 2025 will be retained as the baseline for the 2027-2030 seasons, rather than reverting to pre-2025 license numbers.

10) Public draw hunt license numbers will remain unchanged from the 2023-2026 rule cycle, except those outlined in point 9 above.

11) Shift season dates in SW later to address a later breeding and fawning period, with hunts beginning mid-September.

Deer Rule

The proposal is to amend the Deer Rule 19.31.13 NMAC which will become effective April 1, 2027. The most recent version of the rule will expire on March 31, 2027. Proposed changes include:

Northwest

- 1) Reduce deer licenses in GMU 2B based on input received during current rule cycle.
- 2) In addition to general license reductions in GMU 2B, based on input received during the current rule cycle, the Department analyzed the total number of license reductions required to move GMU 2B to a Quality Hunt unit. Moving GMU 2B to a Quality Hunt unit would require a reduction of 885 deer licenses across public and private land (see table 1 below).
- 3) Create new rifle hunt code in GMU 51A to spread out pressure. The overall license numbers will remain the same.
- 4) Create a public muzzleloader deer hunt on Wildlife Management Areas in GMU 4 to coincide with the private land hunt (10 licenses).

Southwest

- 1) Structure the January hunt on White Sands Missile Range (GMU 19 WSMR only) as a youth hunt.
- 2) Create a December rifle hunt for Coues white-tailed deer in GMUs 16 and 22 (20 licenses in each GMU) to be consistent with Coues white-tailed deer hunts in the southwest.
- 3) GMU 23 and 24 archery hunters who do not harvest an FAD, will no longer be permitted to hunt the Silver City Management Area antlerless hunt. A new hunt code will be created for the Silver City Management Area antlerless archery hunt (50 public licenses and 20 private licenses).
- 4) Change youth rifle hunts in GMUs 13 and 17 to youth muzzleloader hunts to match elk weapon type for the same time and increase licenses for muzzleloader hunts in these units.
- 5) No longer include Fort Bayard as a special management area. Hunters drawing a tag for GMU 24 can hunt any legally accessible land in GMU 24, including Fort Bayard management area.
- 6) Create a public rifle hunt for Mimbres River WMA in GMU 24 (5 licenses).

Southeast

- 1) Remove the REG antlerless hunt in GMU 32 Roswell and Fort Sumner Hunt Areas. Keep Youth Only antlerless hunt (15 public and 20 private licenses).
- 2) Remove the antlerless hunt on the Huey WMA; change the ES hunt to FAD bag limit.
- 3) Significantly reduce licenses in GMUs 29 (-120), 30 (-525), and 34 (-100).

Northeast

Adjust license numbers to meet management strategies and reflect changes in deer herd dynamics (see table 2 below).

General Statewide Proposed Changes

- 1) Adjust license numbers to meet management strategies and reflect changes in deer herd dynamics (Table 2).
- 2) Adjust season dates (Table 2).
 - a. Adjust season dates to ensure harvest is biologically sustainable.
 - b. Shift start dates to maintain hunts beginning on Saturday or adjusting to maintain consistent hunt structure.
 - c. When possible, adjust season dates for hunt structure consistency across the state.
 - d. Adjust season dates to avoid overlapping hunts with mixed-weapon types.
- 3) Designate the premium statewide deer hunt as a Quality Hunt.
- 4) Require the purchase of a license at least a day prior to the start of the hunt. For hunts where published season dates are less than 6 days, hunters will no longer be able to buy a license once the hunt starts.
- 5) Require a “ranch registration” process for OTC private-land deer licenses, similar to the current registration process used for private land elk hunting in Secondary Management Zones.
- 6) Implement a cap on private-land only OTC deer licenses for each GMU. If license distribution within a GMU is disproportionately skewed toward a particular hunt due to private land sales patterns, licenses will be redistributed to reduce that skew, though not necessarily distributed equally across all hunts (Table 3).

Elk Rule

The proposal is to amend the Elk Rule 19.31.14 NMAC which will become effective April 1, 2027. The most recent version of the rule will expire on March 31, 2027. Proposed changes include:

General Statewide Proposed Changes

- 1) Adjust season dates where necessary
 - a. Shifting start dates to maintain hunts beginning on Saturday or adjusting to calendar day starts for consistency.
 - b. Evaluate season dates for hunt structure consistency across the state.
 - c. Evaluate season dates to ensure harvest is biologically sustainable.
- 2) Consider aligning most primary management zone hunts to have a muzzleloader hunt first, followed by any-legal-weapon hunts. Early October hunts shift to muzzleloader to address increased male susceptibility to harvest.
- 3) Adjust some hunts to minimize overlap of weapons used for species hunted.
- 4) Adjust draw license numbers based on biological data and management goals.
 - a. Possible reductions in the following herd units: Greater Gila, Jemez (A), Valle Vidal (A).
 - b. Possible slight increases in the San Juan, Northcentral, Sacramento, and Ruidoso herd units.
 - c. Consider establishing elk hunts in GMU 32 to address an increasing elk population in the area.
- 5) Designate the premium statewide elk hunt (currently ELK-1-700) as a Quality hunt.
- 6) Require the purchase of a license at least one day prior to hunting. For hunts where published season dates are less than 6 days, hunters will no longer be able to buy a license once the hunt starts.
- 7) Possible adjustment of management zone boundaries.
- 8) Re-assess public/private land split due to land ownership changes over the last 4 years.

Specific Proposed Changes

Youth Encouragement

- 1) Eliminate all Youth Encouragement hunts within the Greater Gila elk herd unit (GMUs 15, 16A, 16C, 16D, 16E) to reduce harvest pressure on adult females. Population indices suggest these elk herds are declining as a result of low calf recruitment and high adult female mortality, further intensified by drought conditions. A portion of these licenses will be redistributed to other Youth Encouragement hunts throughout the state.
- 2) Create two new Youth Encouragement hunts of 75 licenses each within GMU 2 to increase harvest pressure on adult females and increase youth opportunity.
- 3) Increase Youth Encouragement hunt licenses within GMUs 34 and 36 to increase harvest pressure on adult females within increasing elk populations in the Sacramento mountains.
- 4) Increase Youth Encouragement hunt licenses within GMU 51.

Northwest Region

- 1) Increase antlerless ('A') licenses within December Youth Only (YO) and December 2C only rifle hunts.
- 2) Change early October Mature Bull ('MB') licenses from any legal weapon to muzzleloader hunts in GMU 5A (10 licenses).

North Central Region

- 1) Create a muzzleloader hunt within the Sargent WMA to begin after archery and before rifle hunt seasons. Bag limit shall be 'MB/A', 10 licenses.
- 2) Create a muzzleloader hunt within the Humphries/Rio Chama WMAs to begin after archery and before rifle hunt seasons. Bag limit shall be 'MB/A', 10 licenses.
- 3) Create a muzzleloader hunt within GMU 5B to begin after archery and before rifle hunt seasons. Bag limit shall be 'MB', 56 licenses.
- 4) Redistribute 37 December 'MB' rifle licenses to the muzzleloader hunt in GMU 5B. Muzzleloader hunts typically have lower success rates; thus, these licenses are redistributed at a ratio of 1:1.5
- 5) Create a muzzleloader hunt within GMU 50 to begin after archery and before rifle hunt seasons. Bag limit shall be 'MB', 65 licenses.
- 6) Redistribute 45 late October and early November 'MB' rifle licenses to new muzzleloader hunt in GMU 50 at a ratio of 1:1.5
- 7) Create a muzzleloader hunt within GMU 51 to begin after archery and before rifle hunt seasons. Bag limit shall be Either-Sex ('ES'), 145 licenses. All licenses for this hunt were redistributed from the existing December muzzleloader hunt in GMU 51.
- 8) Increase 'A' licenses within GMU 51 for both mid and late November hunts from 251 to 265 licenses.

Southwest Region

- 1) Create a muzzleloader hunt within GMU 12 to begin after archery and before rifle hunt seasons. Bag limit shall be 'MB', 35 licenses.
- 2) Create a muzzleloader hunt within GMUs 16A, 16B/22, 16C, and 16D to begin after archery and before rifle hunt seasons. Bag limit shall be 'MB', 35 licenses for each GMU. Redistribute 15 'MB' rifle licenses from GMU 16A to new muzzleloader hunt at a 1:1.5 ratio. Although overall 'MB' licenses will increase slightly within the Greater Gila elk herd, anticipated harvest should be stable or slightly decrease as muzzleloader hunters, on average, have lower success rates. Additionally, pushing rifle 'MB' hunts later in the season will decrease bull susceptibility to harvest during rut. Similar redistributions of rifle hunt licenses shall occur in GMUs 16B/22, 16C, and 16D.
- 3) Reduce 'A' rifle licenses within GMU 16A, 16C, 16D, and 16E by 27-30% and shift cow hunts earlier in the season to reduce adult female mortality in the Greater Gila elk herd unit.
- 4) Create a muzzleloader hunt within GMU 21A to begin after archery and before rifle hunt seasons. Bag limit shall be 'MB', 15 licenses.

Southeast Region

Increase 'A' licenses within both late season (Jan/Feb) cow hunts within GMU 34 from 200 to 230 licenses to increase harvest on adult females in an increasing elk herd unit.

Northeast Region

- 1) Create a muzzleloader hunt within GMU 49 to begin after archery and before rifle hunt seasons. Bag limit shall be 'MB', 20 licenses.
- 2) Redistribute 'MB' a total of 13 October rifle licenses to new muzzleloader hunt in GMU 49 at a ratio of 1:1.5.

Secondary Management Zones

- 1) Create new 'A' late-season rifle hunt in GMUs 29/30 to address increased population within these units (20 licenses).

- 2) Create two new 'ES' rifle hunts within GMU 32 as elk have moved into this region and become more resident than seasonal (30 licenses total).
- 3) Create 2 new 'ES' bow hunts with 20 licenses each in GMU 38 as this elk population is becoming more established.

Special Management Zones

Reduce 'A' licenses by 17% within the Valle Vidal (GMU 55A) to reduce adult female mortality.

CHAPTER 31 HUNTING AND FISHING
PART 15 PRONGHORN ANTELOPE

19.31.15.1 ISSUING AGENCY: New Mexico department of **wildlifegame and fish.**

19.31.15.2 SCOPE: Sportspersons interested in pronghorn **antelope** hunting and management. Additional requirements may be found in Chapter 17, NMSA 1978, and Chapters 30, 31, 32 and 33 of Title 19 NMAC.

19.31.15.3 STATUTORY AUTHORITY: Sections 17-1-14 and 17-1-26 NMSA 1978 provide that the New Mexico state **wildlife game** commission has the authority to establish rules and regulations that it may deem necessary to carry out the purpose of Chapter 17, NMSA 1978 and all other acts pertaining to protected mammals, birds and fish.

19.31.15.4 DURATION: April 1, **2027 2023** through March 31, **2031 2027.**

19.31.15.5 EFFECTIVE DATE: April 1, **2027 2023**, unless a later date is cited at the end of a section.

19.31.15.6 OBJECTIVE: Establishing open hunting seasons and regulations, rules, and procedures governing the distribution and issuance of pronghorn licenses by the department.

19.31.15.7 DEFINITIONS:

- A. “Department”** shall mean the New Mexico department of **wildlifegame and fish.**
 - B. “Director”** shall mean the director of the New Mexico department of **wildlifegame and fish.**
 - C. “Either sex” or “ES”** shall mean any one pronghorn.
 - D. “Female or immature pronghorn” or “F-IM”** shall mean any female pronghorn or any pronghorn with both horns shorter than its ears.
 - E. “Game management unit” or “GMU”** shall mean those areas as described in 19.30.4 NMAC Game Management Units.
 - F. “Mature buck pronghorn” or “MB”** shall mean a pronghorn with at least one horn longer than its ears.
 - G. “Wildlife management areas” or “WMAs”** shall mean those areas as described in 19.34.5 NMAC Wildlife Management Areas.

19.31.15.8 ADJUSTMENT OF LICENSES, AUTHORIZATIONS AND HARVEST LIMITS: The director, with the verbal concurrence of the chairperson of the New Mexico state **wildlifegame** commission or their designee, may adjust the number of licenses, or authorizations for pronghorn up or down to address significant changes in population levels or to address critical department management needs. This adjustment may be applied to any or all of the specific hunt codes for pronghorn, **and may include a limit to the number of private land only licenses by hunt code.** The director may change or cancel all hunts on military lands to accommodate closures on those lands; if changed, the season length and bag limit shall remain the same as assigned on the original hunt code.

19.31.15.9 PRONGHORN POPULATION MANAGEMENT HUNTS:

- A.** The director or their designee may authorize population management hunts for pronghorn when justified in writing by department personnel.
- B.** The director or their designee shall designate the sporting arms, season dates, season lengths, bag limits, hunt boundaries, specific requirements or restrictions, and number of licenses or permits to be issued.
- C.** In the event that an applicant is not able to hunt on the dates specified, the applicant's name shall be moved to the bottom of the list and another applicant may be contacted for the hunt.
- D.** In those instances where a population management hunt is warranted on deeded private lands, the landowner may suggest eligible hunters of their choice by submitting a list of prospective hunter's names to the department for licensing consideration. No more than one-half of the total number of licenses authorized shall be available to landowner identified hunters. The balance of prospective hunters shall be identified by the department.

19.31.15.10 SPECIAL PRONGHORN HUNTING OPPORTUNITIES

- A. Pronghorn conservation recognition program:** Private landowners who are conducting and maintaining substantial habitat improvements and/or land management practices on their deeded lands that directly and significantly benefit pronghorn may be considered for special recognition. Only those projects as determined by the department to be relevant and beneficial to pronghorn will be considered. Landowners must submit an application and once approved, develop a pronghorn conservation and management plan in cooperation with the department. Upon approval of the plan the landowner may be granted alternative season dates as approved by the department. Landowners receiving special recognition are required to submit an update as directed by the department to be considered for continued participation. The hunt code for any unique hunt season approved pursuant to this program shall be **determined by the Department ANT-1-600**.
- B. Ranch-wide agreements:** Properties consisting of deeded and leased public lands deemed by the department to have pronghorn hunting opportunities may enter into an agreement with the department to create a pronghorn hunting ranch. The boundaries would include both the deeded and leased public lands. The department will negotiate with the landowner the number of private licenses to be issued to landowners with ranch-wide agreements. These private licenses shall have access to the deeded and leased public land within the hunting ranch boundary during the respective pronghorn hunt. The landowner shall allow access to the deeded and leased public land to all legally licensed public draw hunters pursuant to Subsection A of Section 19.31.15.11 NMAC for the respective game management unit. Any ranch entered into such an agreement shall be issued one authorization valid for a free pronghorn license pursuant to 17-3-14 NMSA 1978.

19.31.15.11 PRONGHORN HUNTS:

Numbers of licenses are evaluated annually based upon population dynamics, weather conditions, sustainable harvest, and department management objectives.

- A. Public land pronghorn hunts:** Pronghorn draw hunts, listing the open GMUs or areas, eligibility requirements or restrictions, hunt dates, hunt codes, sporting arms type, number of licenses and bag limit shall be as indicated below. Pronghorn draw hunt licenses are valid on all open public lands and any private land the licensee has written permission to hunt within the GMU or area. All WMAs are open to pronghorn hunts in respective GMUs listed in this section unless specifically closed by rule.

B. Private land-only hunts:

(1) Ranch registration requirement: Private lands that lie within GMUs below must register to receive a ranch code. Enrollment process:

a. Land ownership documentation will be required that will verify the ranch lies within valid GMUs.

b. Requests for a ranch code may be submitted to the department at any time.

c. Ranch ownership must be affirmed on an annual basis.

d. Ranches within these GMUs will be issued a ranch code annually to identify individual ownership.

e. A ranch code will be required to purchase a private land pronghorn license for a specific ranch.

f. All licenses require written permission and shall be valid only on the specified property and transferrable with written permission to other private lands within the specified GMU. Written permission requirements for access on private property will follow the provisions found in 19.31.10 NMAC.

B. License restrictionsPrivate land-only pronghorn hunts: Private land-only pronghorn licenses shall be restricted to the hunt dates, eligibility requirements or restrictions, sporting arms type, and bag limit that corresponds to the draw hunt code listed in Subsection A of Section 19.31.15.11 NMAC for the GMU where the private landowner's property lies. Private land-only pronghorn licenses shall be, listing the open GMUs or areas, eligibility requirements or restrictions, hunt dates, hunt codes, sporting arms type, number of licenses and bag limit shall be as indicated below and be unlimited, except the any legal sporting arms hunt in GMUs 4, 50 and 52 shall be limited to 15 licenses, or as otherwise provided in 19.31.15.8 NMAC, and available from any license vendor and the department's web site. These licenses are not valid for ranch-wide agreement properties as described in Subsection B of Section 19.31.15.10 NMAC. Private land-only pronghorn licenses are valid only on deeded private property where the licensee has written permission to hunt, and within the GMU or area allowed by hunt code, except ranch-wide agreement properties. Private land-only pronghorn licenses are not restricted to only one ranch or property. In those GMUs where there is no pronghorn draw hunt (GMUs 4, 14, 46, 48, 54, and 55), hunt dates, eligibility requirements or restrictions, sporting arms type, and bag limit will be:

C. Private land-only F-IM pronghorn hunts: The department will work with interested landowners with sufficient pronghorn populations to authorize F-IM hunts on private deeded land. Sporting arms type, hunt dates, eligibility requirements or restrictions and authorization numbers for private deeded land F-IM hunts will be negotiated to maintain appropriate harvest within the exterior boundaries of participating ranches.

D. Pronghorn hunt for injured service men and women: The department may annually issue up to 15 authorizations for hunting by injured service men and women on Melrose Air Force Range. The director shall determine the procedures for issuing the authorizations, and the dates for each hunt.

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The rulemaking was undertaken to adopt a new Pronghorn Antelope Rule 19.31.15 NMAC which will become effective April 1, 2027. The most recent version of the rule will expire on March 31, 2027.

- 1) Require the purchase of a license at least one day prior to hunting. For hunts where published season dates are less than 6 days, hunters will no longer be able to buy a license once the hunt starts.
- 2) Implement a ranch registration process for purchase of private land OTC pronghorn licenses, similar to the current registration process used for private land elk licenses in Secondary management zones.
- 3) Implement a cap on private land OTC licenses and consider a more even distribution in hunts, similar to the public draw. If license distribution within a GMU is disproportionately skewed toward a particular hunt due to private land sales patterns, licenses will be redistributed to reduce that skew, though not necessarily distributed equally across all hunts.
- 4) Shift GMU 4/50/52 rifle hunt to muzzleloader hunt
- 5) Adjust season dates where necessary. For example, shifting start dates to maintain hunts beginning on Saturday or adjusting calendar day starts for consistency.
- 6) Based on discussions with McGregor and White Sands Missile Range (WSMR) staff:
 - a. McGregor: Decrease from 2 hunts of 7 licenses down to 2 hunts of 2 licenses
 - b. WSMR: Decrease from 1 hunt of 5 down to 1 hunt of 3, and adjusting the bag limit from ES to MB
- 7) Include GMU 48 alongside GMU 47 to allow hunters to access both GMUs during their draw hunt. Licenses will remain the same.
- 8) Similar to bighorn sheep and ibex, shift all F-IM license numbers to be "up to," allowing the Department to adjust draw licenses up or down depending on population surveys.
- 9) Decrease license numbers in GMUs 41, 47, 56, 57, 58, and 59 to match current hunting levels. Specifically, the 20% license reduction implemented in 2025 will be retained as the baseline for the 2027-2030 seasons, rather than reverting to pre-2025 license numbers.
- 10) Public draw hunt license numbers will remain unchanged from the 2023-2026 rule cycle, except those outlined in point 9 above.
- 11) Shift season dates in SW later to address a later breeding and fawning period, with hunts beginning mid-September.

There have been no changes between the published proposed rule and the final rule. There were no substantive arguments made through public comment that were not accepted. The resulting rule was based on what was best for the resource and overall hunter satisfaction.

19.31.15.8 ADJUSTMENT OF LICENSES, AUTHORIZATIONS AND HARVEST LIMITS: The director, with the verbal concurrence of the chairperson of the New Mexico state wildlife commission or their designee, may adjust the number of licenses, or authorizations for pronghorn up or down to address significant changes in population levels or to address critical department management needs. This adjustment may be applied to any or all of the specific hunt codes for pronghorn. The director may change or cancel all hunts on military lands to accommodate closures on those lands; if changed, the season length and bag limit shall remain the same as assigned on the original hunt code.

19.31.15.9 PRONGHORN POPULATION MANAGEMENT HUNTS:

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A. The director or their designee may authorize population management hunts for pronghorn when justified in writing by department personnel.

B. The director or their designee shall designate the sporting arms, season dates, season lengths, bag limits, hunt boundaries, specific requirements or restrictions, and number of licenses or permits to be issued.

C. In the event that an applicant is not able to hunt on the dates specified, the applicant's name shall be moved to the bottom of the list and another applicant may be contacted for the hunt.

D. In those instances where a population management hunt is warranted on deeded private lands, the landowner may suggest eligible hunters of their choice by submitting a list of prospective hunter's names to the department for licensing consideration. No more than one-half of the total number of licenses authorized shall be available to landowner identified hunters. The balance of prospective hunters shall be identified by the department. [19.31.15.9 NMAC - Rp, 19.31.15.11 NMAC, 4/1/2027]

19.31.15.10 SPECIAL PRONGHORN HUNTING OPPORTUNITIES

A. **Pronghorn conservation recognition program:** Private landowners who are conducting and maintaining substantial habitat improvements and/or land management practices on their deeded lands that directly and significantly benefit pronghorn may be considered for special recognition. Only those projects as determined by the department to be relevant and beneficial to pronghorn will be considered. Landowners must submit an application and once approved, develop a pronghorn conservation and management plan in cooperation with the department. Upon approval of the plan the landowner may be granted alternative season dates as approved by the department. Landowners receiving special recognition are required to submit an update as directed by the department to be considered for continued participation. The hunt code for any unique hunt season approved pursuant to this program shall be determined by the Department.

B. **Ranch-wide agreements:** Properties consisting of deeded and leased public lands deemed by the department to have pronghorn hunting opportunities may enter into an agreement with the department to create a pronghorn hunting ranch. The boundaries would include both the deeded and leased public lands. The department will negotiate with the landowner the number of private licenses to be issued to landowners with ranch-wide agreements. These private licenses shall have access to the deeded and leased public land within the hunting ranch boundary during the respective pronghorn hunt. The landowner shall allow access to the deeded and leased public land to all legally licensed public draw hunters pursuant to Subsection A of Section 19.31.15.11 NMAC for the respective game management unit. Any ranch entered into such an agreement shall be issued one authorization valid for a free pronghorn license pursuant to 17-3-14 NMSA 1978. [19.31.15.10 NMAC - N, 4/1/2027]

19.31.15.11 PRONGHORN HUNTS:

Numbers of licenses are evaluated annually based upon population dynamics, weather conditions, sustainable harvest and department management objectives.

A. **Public land pronghorn hunts:** Pronghorn draw hunts, listing the open GMUs or areas, eligibility requirements or restrictions, hunt dates, hunt codes, sporting arms type, number of licenses and bag limit shall be as indicated below. Pronghorn draw hunt licenses are valid on all open public lands and any private land the licensee has written permission to hunt within the GMU or area. All WMAs are open to pronghorn hunts in respective GMUs listed in this section unless specifically closed by rule.

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B. Private land-only hunts:

(1) **Ranch registration requirement:** Private lands that lie within GMUs below must register to receive a ranch code. Enrollment process:

- a. Land ownership documentation will be required that will verify the ranch lies within valid GMUs.
- b. Requests for a ranch code may be submitted to the department at any time.
- c. Ranch ownership must be affirmed on an annual basis.
- d. Ranches within these GMUs will be issued a ranch code annually to identify individual ownership.
- e. A ranch code will be required to purchase a private land pronghorn license for a specific ranch.

f. All licenses require written permission and shall be valid only on the specified property and transferrable with written permission to other private lands within the specified GMU. Written permission requirements for access on private property will follow the provisions found in 19.31.10 NMAC.

(2) **License restrictions:** Private land-only pronghorn licenses, listing the open GMUs or areas, eligibility requirements or restrictions, hunt dates, hunt codes, sporting arms type, number of licenses and bag limit shall be as indicated below and be available from any license vendor and the department's web site. These licenses are not valid for ranch-wide agreement properties as described in Subsection B of Section 19.31.15.10 NMAC. Private land-only pronghorn licenses are valid only on deeded private property where the licensee has written permission to hunt, and within the GMU or area allowed by hunt code, except ranch-wide agreement properties.

C. Private land-only F-IM pronghorn hunts: The department will work with interested landowners with sufficient pronghorn populations to authorize F-IM hunts on private deeded land. Sporting arms type, hunt dates, eligibility requirements or restrictions and authorization numbers for private deeded land F-IM hunts will be negotiated to maintain appropriate harvest within the exterior boundaries of participating ranches.

D. Pronghorn hunt for injured service men and women: The department may annually issue up to 15 authorizations for hunting by injured service men and women on Melrose Air Force Range. The director shall determine the procedures for issuing the authorizations, and the dates for each hunt.

New Mexico Pronghorn Population

- Population growth driven by female and fawn survival
 - Populations impacted by long-term drought
- Buck harvest not limiting to population growth
- Statewide average:
 - 29 bucks: 100 does: 29 fawns
 - Buck ratio adequate for recreational opportunities



New Mexico Pronghorn Population

- Pronghorn exhibit quick growth
 - Males can achieve max horn size by ~3 years
 - Females have high pregnancy rates by 1.5 years
 - Twin fawns: results in quicker population rebounds under favorable conditions
- Male harvest
 - Can harvest at higher rates than other ungulates & maintain high trophy quality (Tafelmeyer et al. 2024)
 - Does not impact populations unless B:D ratios decline enough to impact female pregnancy rate



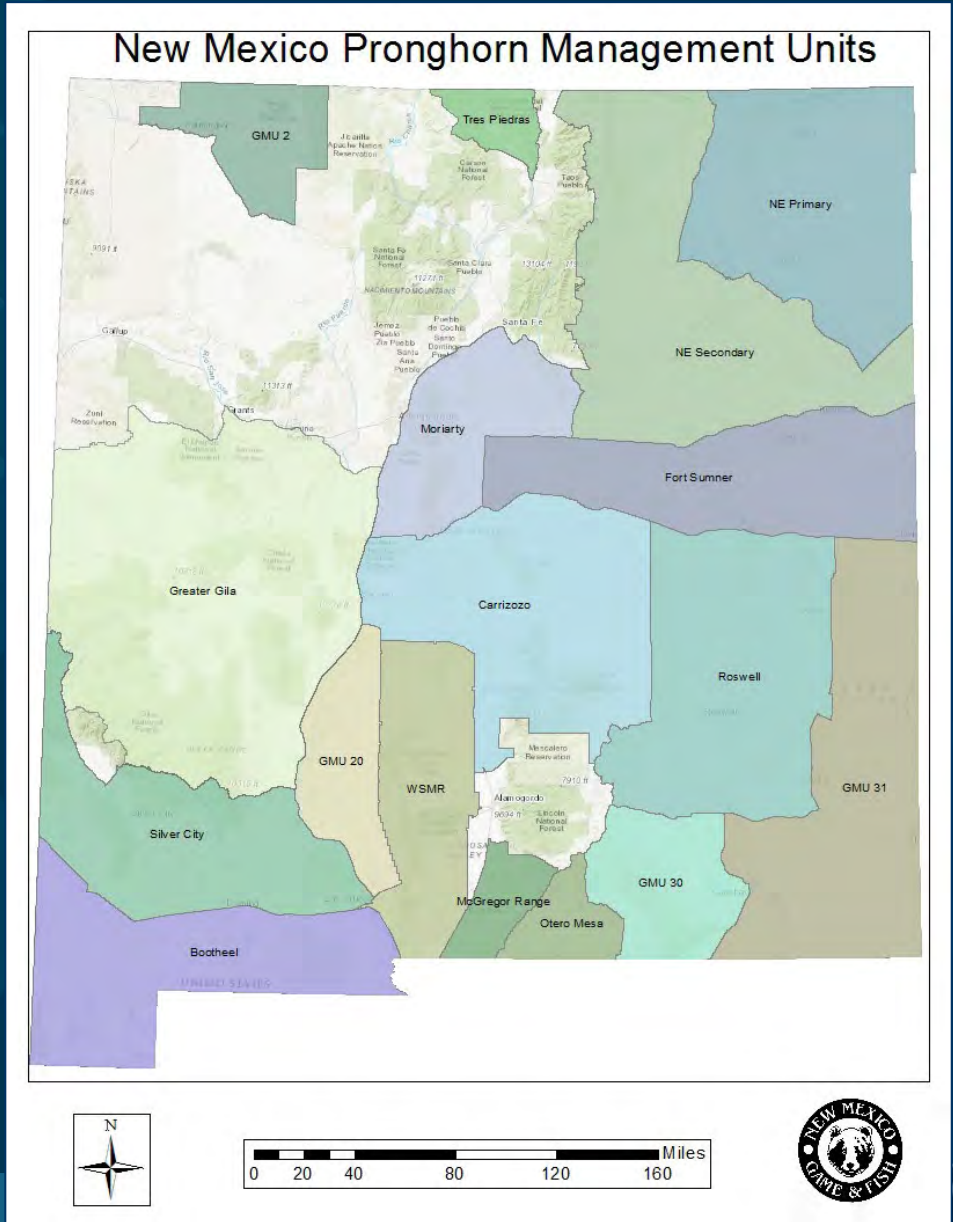

- Long-term drought & adult female senescence likely driving population decline
- Buck numbers have remained >20:100
- Eliminated F/IM hunts, decreased MB tags by 20% and implemented a cap on private land tags to 80% of average license sales.



NE Recommendations

- Maintain decreased licenses implemented in 2025 season
- Open GMU 48 to hunting (combine w/ 47)
- GMU 4/50/52 (Tres Piedras): shift rifle hunt back to muzzleloader hunt based on public feedback received during 2023-2026 rule cycle

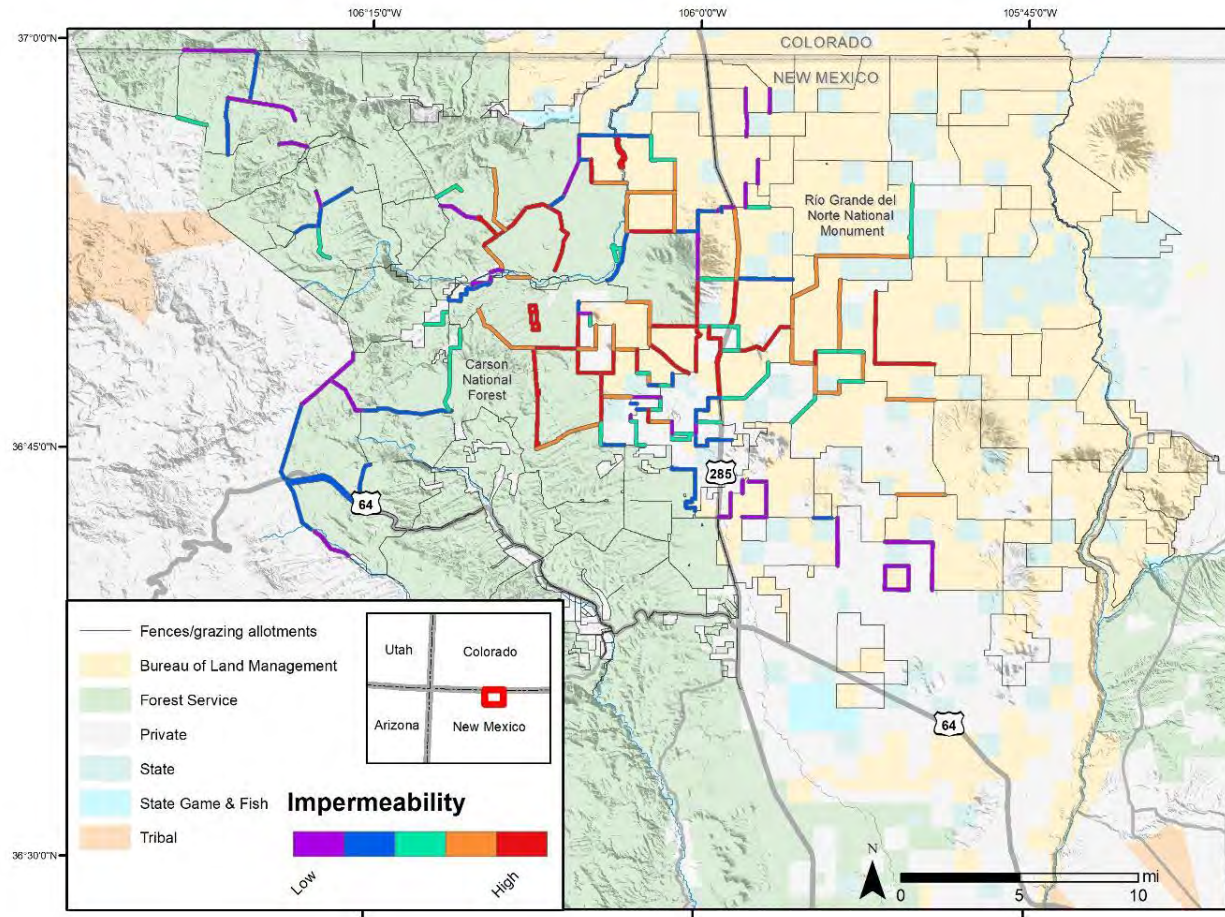


Pronghorn biology: NW Area

Tres Piedras Barrier Analysis

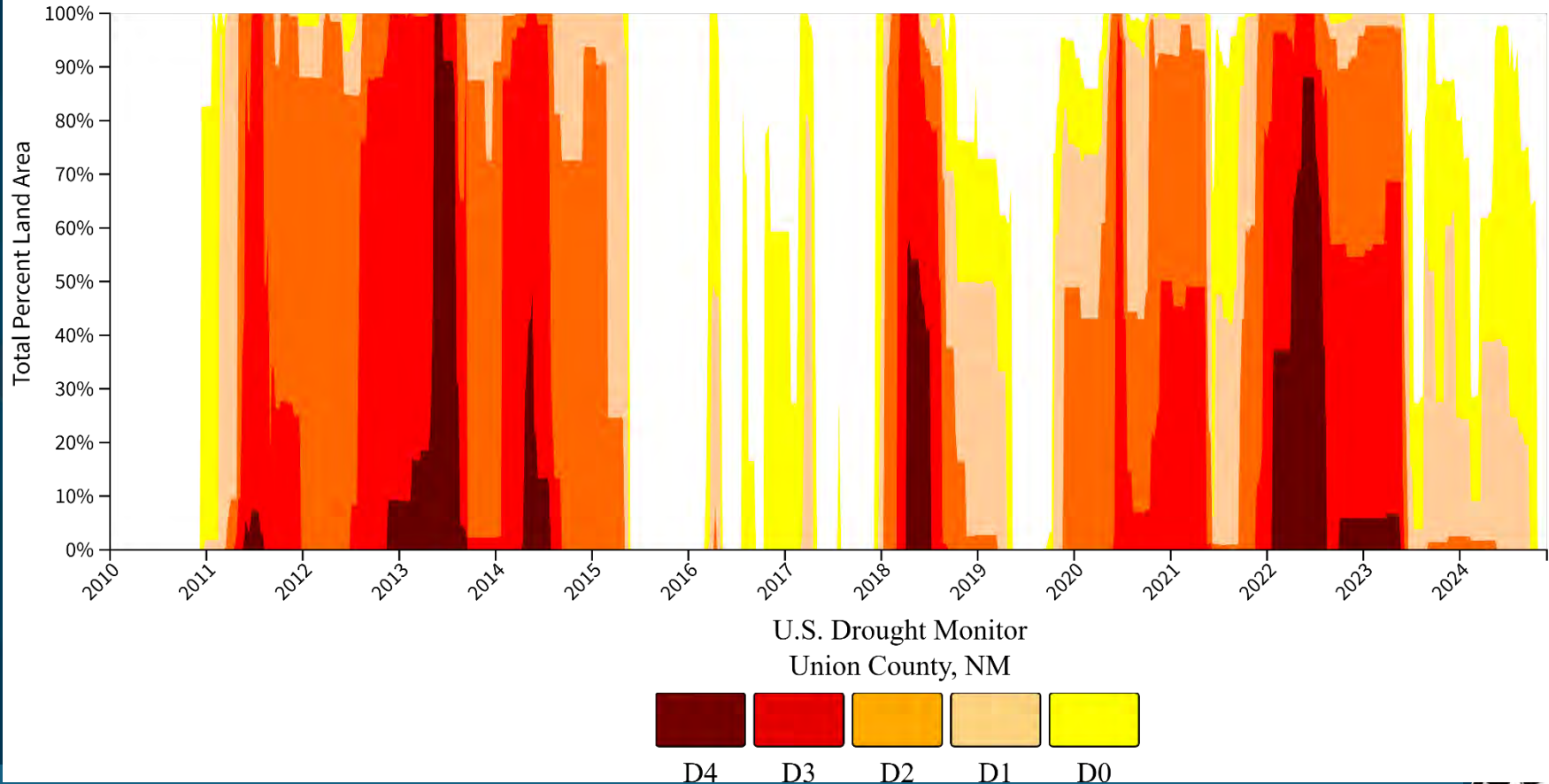

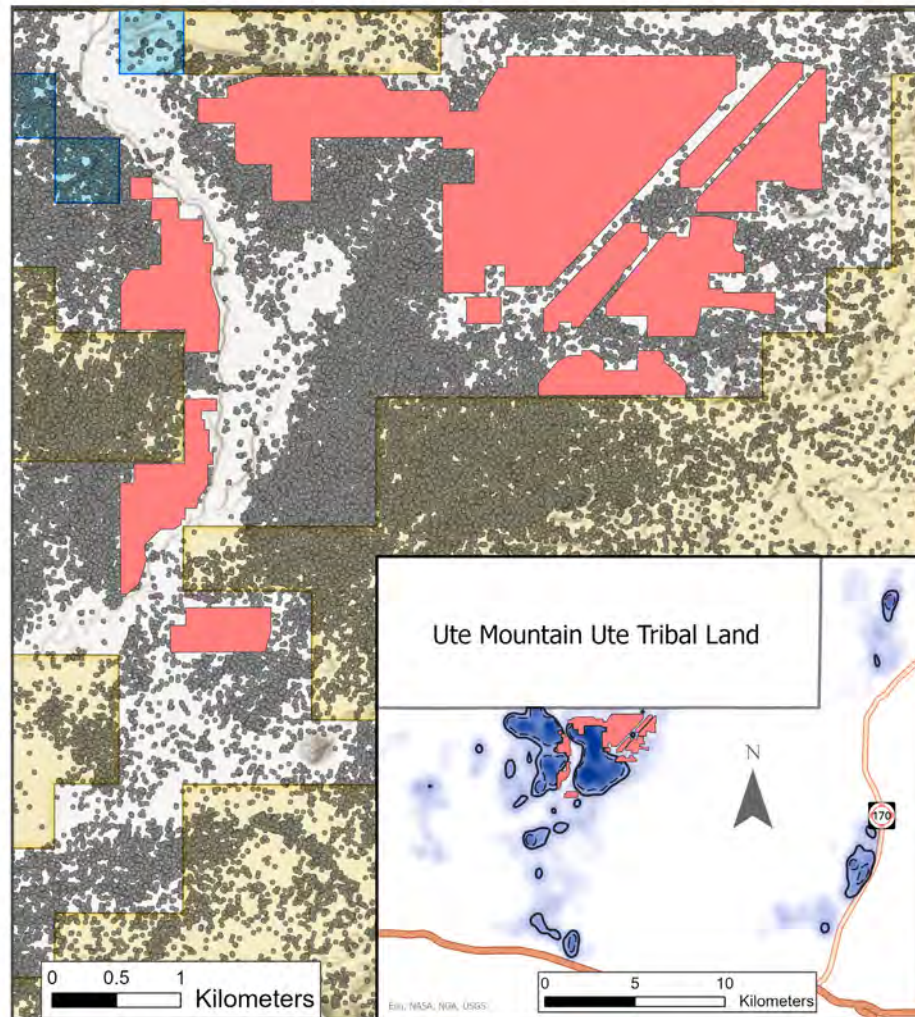

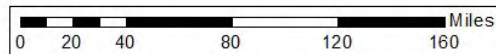
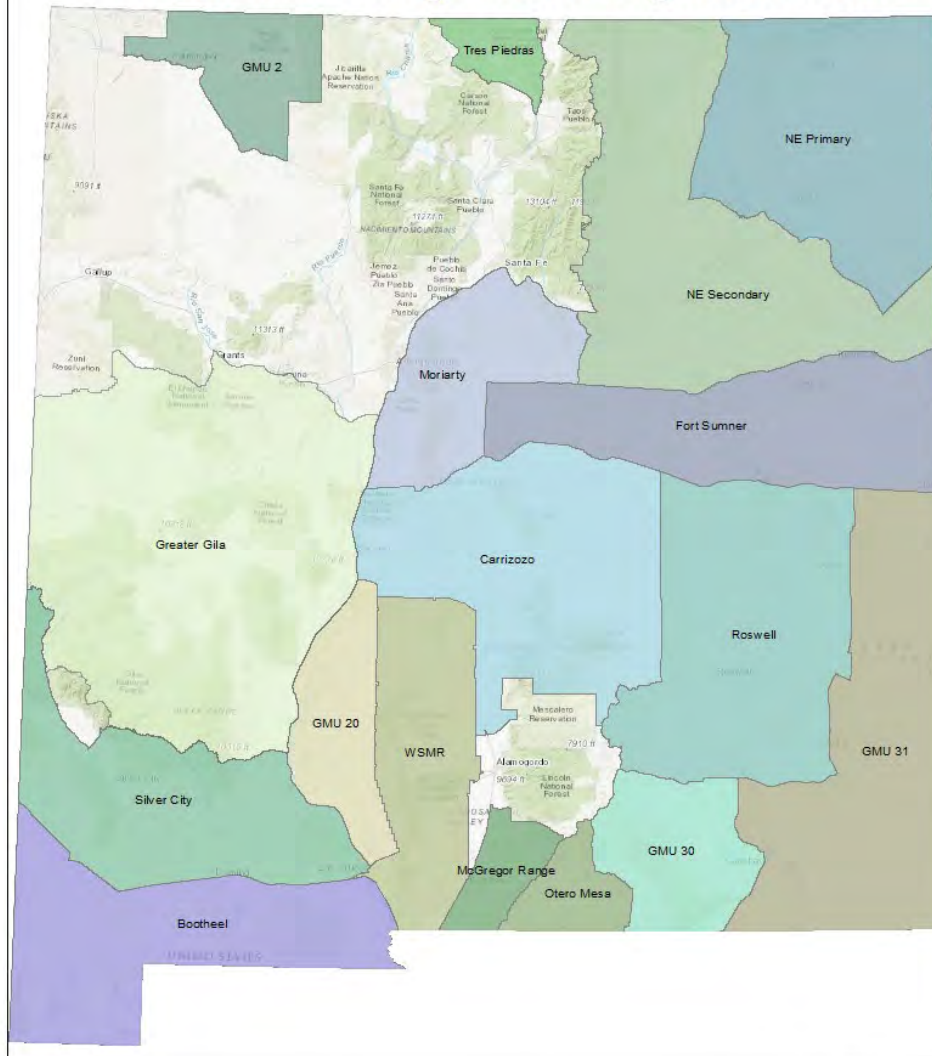


Hunter survey results

New Mexico Pronghorn Management Units



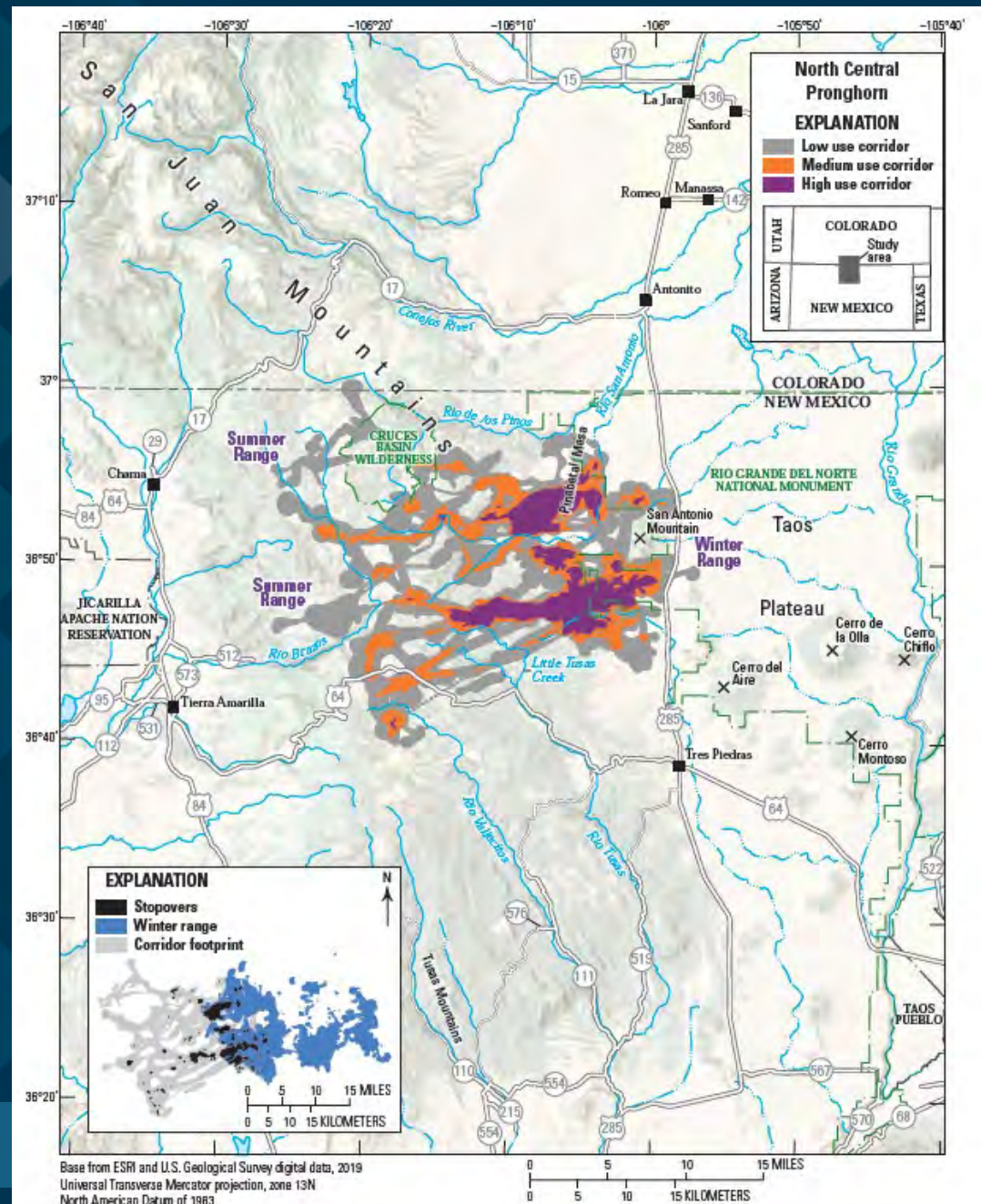

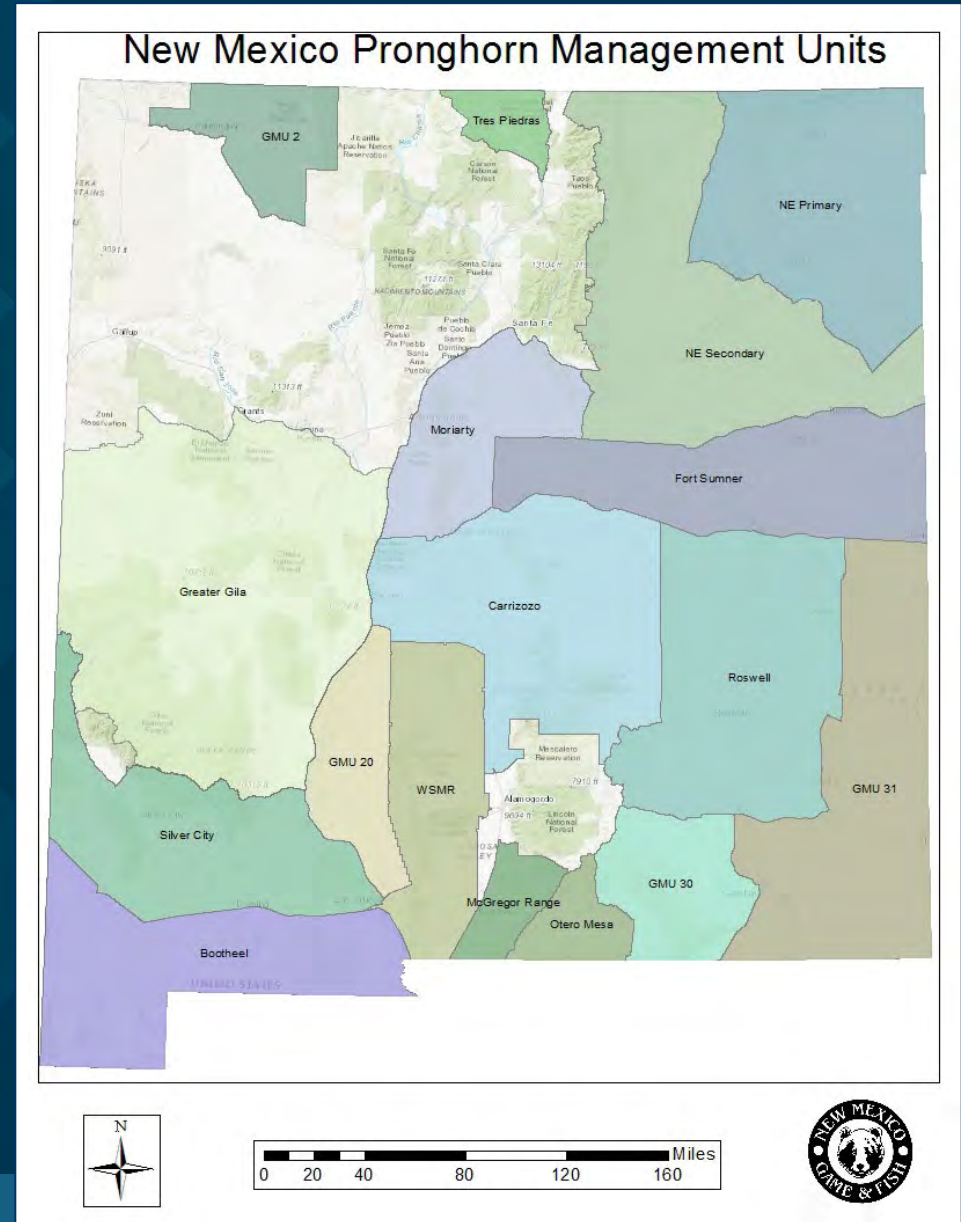

PRONGHORN BIOLOGY

Pronghorn population growth is driven by both adult female and fawn survival and is typically not greatly affected by male harvest. Except for in a few very specific instances to address nuisance issues, the Department allows male harvest only. Population trajectories are driven by adult female and fawn survival; both adult female and fawn survival rates need to be adequate for stable populations. Weather, disease, predation and human induced mortality can all impact adult female and fawn survival; however, availability of forage and concealment cover can lessen or intensify the effect of these individual factors. Pronghorn have a polygamous breeding strategy where a single male will breed many females within a season. Because of this breeding strategy, almost all (>95%) breeding age females become pregnant each year even though there are generally fewer males than females in a population. Studies have shown that when the number of bucks stays above 10 bucks per 100 does, pregnancy rates are consistent and high. As such, buck mortality, including mortality from harvest, does not negatively impact population growth because females carry pregnancies and almost all of them are pregnant each year.

PROPOSED CHANGES TO PRONGHORN HUNTING

- 1) Require the purchase of a license at least one day prior to hunting. For hunts where published season dates are less than 6 days, hunters will no longer be able to buy a license once the hunt starts.
- 2) Implement a ranch registration process for purchase of private land OTC pronghorn licenses, similar to the current registration process used for private land elk licenses in Secondary management zones.
- 3) Implement a cap on private land OTC licenses and consider a more even distribution in hunts, similar to the public draw. If license distribution within a GMU is disproportionately skewed toward a particular hunt due to private land sales patterns, licenses will be redistributed to reduce that skew, though not necessarily distributed equally across all hunts. See table in Appendix 1 for details.
- 4) Shift GMU 4/50/52 rifle hunt to muzzleloader hunt
- 5) Adjust season dates where necessary. For example, shifting start dates to maintain hunts beginning on Saturday or adjusting calendar day starts for consistency.
- 6) Based on discussions with McGregor and White Sands Missile Range (WSMR) staff, we recommended the following:
 - McGregor: Decrease from 2 hunts of 7 licenses down to 2 hunts of 2 licenses
 - WSMR: Decrease from 1 hunt of 5 down to 1 hunt of 3, and adjusting the bag limit from ES to MB
- 7) Include GMU 48 alongside GMU 47 to allow hunters to access both GMUs during their draw hunt. Licenses will remain the same.
- 8) Similar to bighorn sheep and ibex, shift all F-IM license numbers to be “up to,” allowing the Department to adjust draw licenses up or down depending on population surveys.
- 9) Decrease license numbers in GMUs 41, 47, 56, 57, 58, and 59 to match current hunting levels. Specifically, the 20% license reduction implemented in 2025 will be retained as the baseline for the 2027-2030 seasons, rather than reverting to pre-2025 license numbers.
- 10) Public draw hunt license numbers will remain unchanged from the 2023-2026 rule cycle, except those outlined in point 9 above.
- 11) Shift season dates in SW later to address a later breeding and fawning period, with hunts beginning mid-September.

Studies have shown that when the number of bucks stays above 10 bucks per 100 does, pregnancy rates are consistent and high. As such, buck mortality, including mortality from harvest, does not negatively impact population growth because females carry pregnancies and almost all of them are pregnant each year.

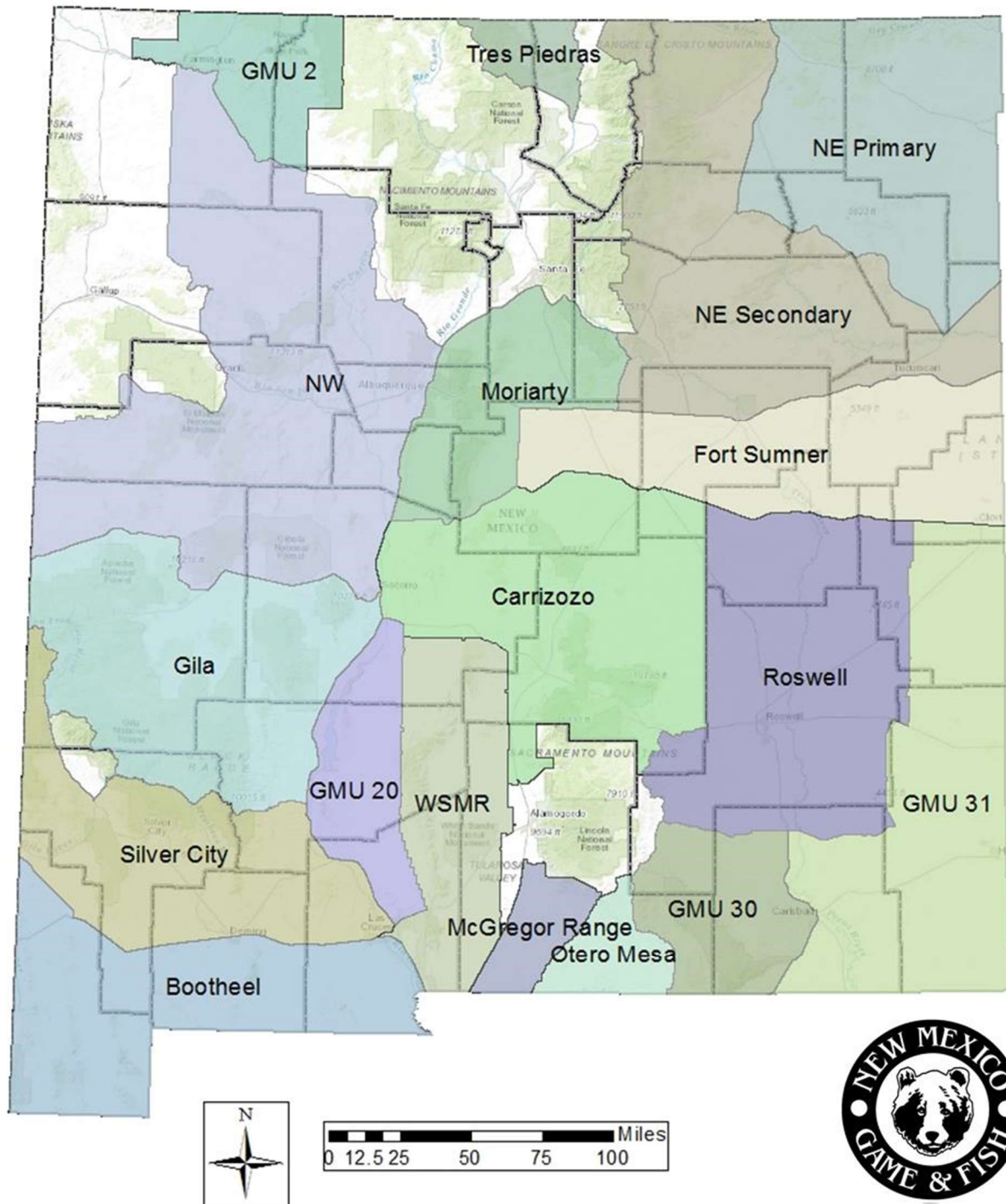


Figure 1. Pronghorn Management Units (PMU) that define potentially interbreeding herds of pronghorn in New Mexico and are used to define survey areas, estimate pronghorn densities, and determine potential harvest levels, New Mexico, USA, 2015-2021

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Dear Commissioners and Mr. Liley

I am a landowner in Union County, NM within Game Management Unit (GMU) 56 and after review of the proposed rule changes for pronghorn antelope it appears that a cap has been proposed on the number of over the counter (OTC) tags that can be purchased. While this cap is a good idea as pronghorn numbers in the area seem to have declined significantly in the past 10 years, the proposal appears to disproportionately favor the number of public tags compared to private tags available. This seems unfair to landowners, particularly when compared to the percentage of private land versus public land within GMU 56 (significantly more private land within the Unit).

In addition to being a landowner I am also a Union County Commissioner and while not acting in official capacity with this email (simply as a concerned landowner), I have heard from a number of constituents in Union County that also believe this proposed rule change is unfair to private landowners. While the decline in antelope populations in my area may not entirely be attributed to the past change from the A-PLUS program to OTC tags (drought, harsh winters, etc. also likely contributed), I believe the previous A-PLUS program was fair to both landowners and public land hunters and allowed for better game management.

However, with regard to the current proposed rule changes, I would respectfully ask the Commission to consider cutting the number of proposed antelope tags available for public lands to be in line with the cap proposed for private lands (a cap ratio comparable to actual land ownership status within the GMU). Thank you for your consideration in this matter.

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After listening to the Game and Fish Commission yesterday and hearing their plans to redistribute tags across the three pronghorn hunts to help spread hunting pressure out more evenly, I do like that idea.

I'm still nervous about the cap, though. I'm just not sure it's necessary statewide when buck populations in many areas appear to be stable. I've already been scouting and have found more than enough bucks on our properties pushing into the high 70s. These are not huge ranches either — they are smaller properties surrounded by other private and state land. To me, that shows we are not the only landowners managing the herds properly.

I will say that after hearing the proposal explained more in depth, I'm not as strongly against the cap as I was before. However, it still doesn't completely sit well with me, and I would encourage the Commission to continue asking questions about the long-term effects. In particular, I think it is important to watch for trends where large ranches with outfitters or very large customer bases begin receiving the majority of the tags, or situations where one part of a unit receives heavy hunting pressure while another area ends up with very few tags being used.

I understand the tags would be sold on a first-come, first-served basis, but I also believe older ranchers and smaller landowners could be at a disadvantage. Many may not be able to line up hunters as quickly or may have properties in multiple units and need to have time to decide what properties them, their family or paying hunters will hunt that year, especially if the purchase date is set too early in the year. That could make it harder for them to harvest enough pronghorn to keep their numbers stable.

I would recommend setting the purchase date sometime around the middle of June.

For all elk, deer and antelope collectively, look into specifically Unit 4 Q/HD deer/ elk hunts for which individuals and or family units appear to draw licenses consistently.

LASTLY AND PLEASE CONSIDER:

Impose a one or two year waiting period for those who draw a license for any specific game animal. That would increase the number of tags available for those species every draw cycle!

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1. As previously recommended by the Department, move the southern Pronghorn hunts to September and October timeframe. For example, there are no elk hunts in October in GMU's 25, 26, and 27, therefore October hunts make sense from a biological perspective. Pronghorn breed later in the year in the south, therefore fawns are born in the August/September timeframe. Also, it is extremely hot in the southern part of the state in August. I also recommend moving the GMU's 23 and 24 Pronghorn hunts to September and October. Keep current structure with archery hunts first followed by rifle Youth, mobility impaired and any person hunts.
2. Agree with creating a system to restrict the current unlimited private land pronghorn licenses.

To Whom it May Concern:

My name is Darrell Brown, President of the Otero County Cattleman's Association (OCCA) and I am writing on behalf of OCCA's membership in regards to the proposed rule development information for hunting, fishing, and other wildlife-related rules.

Please see below our comments and desires as per the proposed rule:

Deer--GMU 29 and GMU 30, more particularly from the Guadalupe Mountains to the west:

According to the Deer Management, New Mexico Department of Game and Fish, prepared by Orrin Duvuvuei, Deer program Manager, and updated in May of 2025: *"When drought is prolonged, or when seasonal precipitation does not come at optimal times, deer will have reduced body condition and recruitment will be lower. This can result in higher mortality rates from all causes. Three consecutive years of above-average rainfall are often needed for mule deer populations to experience significant growth in this ecoregion (Heffelfinger 2006)."* This same study prepared by Orrin Duvuvuei also states in regards to the Guadalupe Mountains Deer Management Zone that: *"Deer densities and the resulting population size in the Guadalupe Mountains are considered low."*

GMU areas 29 and 30 have been in a continual drought for many years with the most recent years being classified as being in the severe category. However, 2025 saw average to above average moisture throughout the area. As stated above, deer densities are recognized as being low in these hunting units and that three consecutive years of above-average rainfall are needed to increase mule deer populations. With this being said, OCCA proposes that all deer hunting is postponed in these two GMU's for at least a five year period to observe and document the status of the recovery of the mule deer.

Elk---GMU 34:

According to the Elk Management, New Mexico Department of Game and Fish, prepared by Travis Zaffarano, Elk Program Manager, updated on June 5, 2025: *"The herd is increasing, despite the higher female harvest in recent years."* As a cattle organization, many of our members are negatively affected by the excessive numbers

of elk in Unit 34. Not only is there destruction of fencing and infrastructure, which is costly to replace or repair, it is also time consuming which takes away from other duties. Ranchers are being extremely harmed by the reduction in total cattle numbers. Elk are consuming vast amounts of the forage and are in competition with the cattle for this forage. Cattle are a valuable source of income for local families and communities as well as an important and necessary food source for our country. OCCA supports the concept of 5) b. of the proposed rules, *“Possible slight increases in the San Juan, Northcentral, Sacramento, and Ruidoso herd units.”* However, OCCA believes and proposes that there should be a substantial increase in draw license numbers for GMU 34 not a “slight” one.

Oryx---GMU 29 and GMU 30, more particularly from the Guadalupe Mountains to the west:

Oryx are admittedly an invasive, non-native species and have well expanded beyond what was expected at the beginning of their introduction. They have no known natural predators in this area. Oryx tend to be aggressive toward other animals as well as humans at times. This aggression negatively affects both domestic and wild animals. Not only are they in competition with other animals so far as water and forage, they can be and often are very destructive to fences and other infrastructure. This destruction to physical improvements and the disruption of domestic animals natural actions is costly to those that are trying to make a living from the off-range lands inhabited by these introduced animals. As per the New Mexico Department of Wildlife’s website, it states that: *“Unprotected species damage habitat and compete with native wildlife.”* OCCA believes that Oryx both damage habitat as well as compete with native wildlife. Therefore, OCCA proposes that off-range Oryx become classified as a nuisance and/or a non-protected animal.

Pronghorn Antelope---GMU 29:

Antelope numbers located in Unit 29 have been declining. Drought and predation have contributed to this reduction. OCCA proposes the Unit 29 is returned to ranch only hunts as it has been in the past plus encourages the removal of natural predators to the antelope.

Even though off-road vehicle (ORV) driving is not included in these proposed rules, OCCA wants to take the opportunity to express our thoughts. OCCA believes that ORV driving goes hand in hand with hunting all species of animals on state and federal lands. Driving off-road or off of designated trails can lead to soil erosion, which degrades the land and ground cover. It can negatively affect water quality by increasing sediment runoff. This was very evident by what occurred in the Sacramento Mountains on the Lincoln National Forest last year. The New Mexico Department of Wildlife, the New Mexico State Land Office, the Bureau of Land Management, and the United States Forest Service should work together to ensure that the rules of off-road driving are judiciously enforced.

I am writing to comment on the New Mexico Game and Fish possible upcoming hunting and game designation rules that are visited every two years for updates, rule changes, season, timing and game animal designations. These suggestions deal mostly with Unit 29.

I would like to see Oryx categorized as a non-game animal except on U.S. Military Lands where the Oryx Currently reside. Oryx are known to be very destructive, mostly to pasture fence infrastructure. The cost to repair, or replace, fencing has grown so expensive as to make the process untenable and time consuming.

I would ask NMG&F to return the pronghorn antelope hunts in Unit 29 to the ranch only hunt as it was in the past. I believe this should be done in order to increase antelope numbers. The numbers have diminished due to long-term drought.

Furthermore, the deer numbers appear to be at an all time low due to persistent drought and pressure from lions and fawn mortality due to the coyotes. This area should be removed from deer hunting for at least five years, or possibly more, depending on the actual deer herd recovery numbers.

Due to rapidly increasing damage being done by off-road driving, there needs to be additional enforcement of the off-road rules. This should include all the lands under state and federal jurisdiction.

These comments are my personal views, but there are many like-minded permittees and allotment owners that share these thoughts.

Dear Commissioners and Department Staff,

On behalf of the New Mexico chapter of Backcountry Hunters & Anglers, we appreciate the opportunity to provide input on the proposed pronghorn rule changes. We value the Department's continued work to manage pronghorn populations while adapting to changing conditions across the state.

As an organization representing public land hunters, we are supportive of efforts that improve transparency, accountability, and long-term sustainability.

In parts of northeastern New Mexico, we have observed declines in fawn recruitment in recent years. When conditions shift in this way, it becomes increasingly important that management tools provide clear visibility into harvest and allow the Department to respond effectively at a regional level.

The current structure, in which private land opportunity can expand with limited visibility or constraint, is increasingly difficult to justify, particularly in areas where herd conditions are changing significantly. Without clear tracking and accountability, the Department's ability to understand and manage harvest at a meaningful scale is limited.

Private Land Licensing Structure

We support the Department's evaluation of a ranch registration system for private land pronghorn licenses.

A registration system:

- Improves visibility into where harvest is occurring
- Provides a clearer understanding of hunting pressure across the landscape
- Creates a framework for future management adjustments if needed
- Supports more consistent application of regulations across private lands

We also support the Department's consideration of caps on private land OTC licenses

Establishing caps:

- Helps ensure harvest remains aligned with current herd conditions
- Prevents unchecked expansion of opportunity in areas under pressure

Here are my comments on the proposed rule changes for pronghorn for the 2027-2031 rule cycle:

1. I agree with the proposal to require the purchase of a license one day prior to the start of a hunt.
2. I agree to the proposal requiring a ranch registration process of the purchase of private land OTC pronghorn licenses.
3. I fully agree that all private land pronghorn licenses should be capped. For too many years private ranchers have over harvested pronghorns, and for the sustainability of the overall herd, caps should be instituted statewide for all public and private licenses.
4. I neither agree or disagree with the shift of GMU 4 rifle hunt to muzzleloader. Muzzleloaders without scopes are causing crippling loss at alarming rates, so I would be interested to understand the reasoning behind the proposed shift in legal weapon for GMU 4 pronghorn.
5. I agree to the proposal to shift season dates to ensure hunts start on Saturdays. I believe this overall strategy is beneficial to the public. In special circumstances where overlap may occur, I would support other start days as needed, but I believe Saturday starts benefit the majority of hunters.
6. I agree that the Department of War (formally Department of Defense) should be consulted and partnered with for hunts that may occur on DoW lands. Additionally, the DoW should provide publicly accessible hunts when possible for species that occur on military lands, including pronghorn.
7. I agree that license numbers need to adjust to meet management strategies and as a result of changing herd dynamics. However, I think these changes should be done every two years, as opposed to every 4 to prevent the large peaks and valleys of population trends. Additionally, I would like to better understand the dept.'s strategy for pronghorn with regards to numbers. Antelope tags are by far the hardest tag to draw, and are highly sought by hunters in NM (men, women and kids), so a high population is desirable from a hunter perspective to accommodate the demand. I'm interested to know what the various herd numbers are, and what the dept. wants them to be.
8. I agree that dates in the SW and South in general need to be shifted to accommodate the later rut cycle and fawning period.

- I do wish the language was stronger on the "consider" the cap for OTC. I think that should be a definite with some restrictions provided on how many tags a private ranch can buy based on acreage.
- I also would like to see all hunts switched to later dates, not just the SW part of the state. These August hunts are too hot
- I think that all of the youth hunts need to be switched to Mature Buck instead of ES. I appreciate wanting to give youths the opportunity to be successful, but I just feel that any mature Does taken is a detriment to the population that we can't afford. The other part of this is that with some of these hunts being in August, I'm not liking the possible outcome of a small fawn being left alone if the mother is shot. I'm afraid this might have happened in unit 52 last year with the youth hunt being the first weekend of August. I saw a very small fawn all by itself.
- Lastly, I think there should be more muzzleloader hunts created. Instead of having 2 or 3 rifle hunts in the unit, give some muzzy tags. Success rates are lower on muzzleloader after removing scopes, so might give the opportunity to have some additional tags without taking out any more bucks then already being taken.

Kind greetings from Taos County! I am contacting you today because I believe there are some issues that need to be considered and changes made to the game allocations for the antelope draw. There are too many pronghorn tags issued to outfitters and landowners. This policy turns, sport, recreational and family fun hunting into a for-profit business, that guarantees profits for outfitters and private landowners, leaving very little for the average Joe resident hunters. Many families depend on elk, deer and antelope meat to live on during Winter months along with family fun times. In my opinion, outfitters and landowners should get the left overs, after public resident hunters draw their tags. This would improve the quality of the harvest and makes sure the public gets a fair and equitable chance for a successful harvest. Excessive landowner tags, impacts the size and quality of the herds. The New Mexico Department of Wildlife should prioritize New Mexico, public land hunters over profits for landowners and outfitters. I have noticed that some landowners in some units, can sell unlimited tags on their ranches, degrading the overall quality of the animals for everyone, as many animals are taken before they have time to fully mature. Many times it is a double whammy because landowners are selling too many tags to outfitters. Outfitters should not be able to hunt on public lands. Too many hunters have never drawn for antelope after years of participating in the draw, only to see outfitters and landowners advertising, hunts for \$5000 per hunter in the units that they put in for. Agenda Title: Rule Making Hearing on Final Changes on the Pronghorn Rule (19.31.15 NMAC) for the 2027 – 2030 hunting seasons.

1. Summary of Agenda Item

The Department will present proposed changes to the Pronghorn Rule (19.31.15 NMAC) based on survey information, management goals, and public comment. The Department held 2 hybrid in-person/virtual public meetings and have also received public comments on the rule.

The Department is proposing the following changes to 19.31.15 NMAC:

- Require purchase of a license a day prior to the start of a hunt.
- Implement a ranch registration process for purchase of private land OTC pronghorn licenses, similar to the current registration process used for private land elk hunting in Secondary management zones.
- Implement a cap on private land OTC licenses.
- Shift GMU 4/50/52 rifle hunt to muzzleloader hunt.
- Adjust season dates where necessary. For example, shifting start dates to maintain hunts beginning on Saturday or adjusting calendar day starts for consistency.
- Adjust license numbers to meet management strategies and reflect changes in pronghorn herd dynamics.
- Shift season dates in SW later to address a later breeding and fawning period.
- Include F-IM hunts that have “up to” license numbers (it is possible that the Department may draw zero licenses for certain hunts)
- Decrease licenses on McGregor from 7 licenses over 2 hunt periods to 2 licenses over 2 hunt periods.

2. Background Information

The pronghorn rule (19.31.15 NMAC) is re-evaluated every 4 years and changed based on population data, management goals, and public feedback.

Except for in a few very specific instances to address nuisance issues, the Department allows male harvest only. Population trajectories are driven by adult female and fawn survival; both adult female and fawn survival rates need to be adequate for stable populations. Weather, disease, predation and human induced mortality can all impact adult female and fawn survival; however, availability of forage and concealment cover can lessen or intensify the effect of these individual factors. Pronghorn have a polygamous breeding strategy where a single male will breed many females within a season. Because of this breeding strategy, almost all (>95%) breeding age females become pregnant each year even though there are generally fewer males than females in a population. Studies have shown that when the number of bucks stays above 10

bucks per 100 does, pregnancy rates are consistent and high. As such, buck mortality, including mortality from harvest, does not negatively impact population growth because females carry pregnancies and almost all of them are pregnant each year.

19.31.15.7 DEFINITIONS:

- A. **"Department"** shall mean the New Mexico department of **wildlifegame and fish.**
 - B. **"Director"** shall mean the director of the New Mexico department of **wildlifegame and fish.**
 - C. **"Either sex" or "ES"** shall mean any one pronghorn.
 - D. **"Female or immature pronghorn" or "F-IM"** shall mean any female pronghorn or any pronghorn with both horns shorter than its ears.
 - E. **"Game management unit" or "GMU"** shall mean those areas as described in 19.30.4 NMAC-Game Management Units.
 - F. **"Mature buck pronghorn" or "MB"** shall mean a pronghorn with at least one horn longer than its ears.
 - G. **"Wildlife management areas" or "WMAs"** shall mean those areas as described in 19.34.5 NMAC Wildlife Management Areas.

19.31.15.8 ADJUSTMENT OF LICENSES, AUTHORIZATIONS AND HARVEST LIMITS: The director, with the verbal concurrence of the chairperson of the New Mexico state **wildlifegame** commission or their designee, may adjust the number of licenses, or authorizations for pronghorn up or down to address significant changes in population levels or to address critical department management needs. This adjustment may be applied to any or all of the specific hunt codes for pronghorn, **and may include a limit to the number of private land-only licenses by hunt code.** The director may change or cancel all hunts on military lands to accommodate closures on those lands; if changed, the season length and bag limit shall remain the same as assigned on the original hunt code.

19.31.15.9 PRONGHORN POPULATION MANAGEMENT HUNTS:

A. The director or their designee may authorize population management hunts for pronghorn when justified in writing by department personnel.

B. The director or their designee shall designate the sporting arms, season dates, season lengths, bag limits, hunt boundaries, specific requirements or restrictions, and number of licenses or permits to be issued.

C. In the event that an applicant is not able to hunt on the dates specified, the applicant's name shall be moved to the bottom of the list and another applicant may be contacted for the hunt.

D. In those instances where a population management hunt is warranted on deeded private lands, the landowner may suggest eligible hunters of their choice by submitting a list of prospective hunter's names to the department for licensing consideration. No more than one-half of the total number of licenses authorized shall be available to landowner identified hunters. The balance of prospective hunters shall be identified by the department.

19.31.15.10 SPECIAL PRONGHORN HUNTING OPPORTUNITIES

A. Pronghorn conservation recognition program: Private landowners who are conducting and maintaining substantial habitat improvements and/or land management practices on their deeded lands that directly and significantly benefit pronghorn may be considered for special recognition. Only those projects as determined by the department to be relevant and beneficial to pronghorn will be considered. Landowners must submit an application and once approved, develop a pronghorn conservation and management plan in cooperation with the department. Upon approval of the plan the landowner may be granted alternative season dates as approved by the department. Landowners receiving special recognition are required to submit an update as directed by the department to be considered for continued participation. The hunt code for any unique hunt season approved pursuant to this program shall be **determined by the Department**. ~~ANT-1-600.~~

B. Ranch-wide agreements: Properties consisting of deeded and leased public lands deemed by the department to have pronghorn hunting opportunities may enter into an agreement with the department to create a pronghorn hunting ranch. The boundaries would include both the deeded and leased public lands. The department will negotiate with the landowner the number of private licenses to be issued to landowners with ranch-wide agreements. These private licenses shall have access to the deeded and leased public land within the hunting ranch boundary during the respective pronghorn hunt. The landowner shall allow access to the deeded and leased public land to all legally licensed public draw hunters pursuant to Subsection A of Section 19.31.15.11 NMAC for the respective game management unit. Any ranch entered into such an agreement shall be issued one authorization valid for a free pronghorn license pursuant to 17-3-14 NMSA 1978.

19.31.15.11 PRONGHORN HUNTS:

Numbers of licenses are evaluated annually based upon population dynamics, weather conditions, sustainable harvest, and department management objectives.

A. Public land pronghorn hunts: Pronghorn draw hunts, listing the open GMUs or areas, eligibility requirements or restrictions, hunt dates, hunt codes, sporting arms type, number of licenses and bag limit shall be as indicated below. Pronghorn draw hunt licenses are valid on all open public lands and any private land the licensee has written permission to hunt within the GMU or area. All WMAs are open to pronghorn hunts in respective GMUs listed in this section unless specifically closed by rule.

B. Private land-only hunts:

(1) Ranch registration requirement: Private lands that lie within GMUs below must register to receive a ranch code. Enrollment process:

a. Land ownership documentation will be required that will verify the ranch lies within valid GMUs.

b. Requests for a ranch code may be submitted to the department at any time.

c. Ranch ownership must be affirmed on an annual basis.

d. Ranches within these GMUs will be issued a ranch code annually to identify individual ownership.

e. A ranch code will be required to purchase a private land pronghorn license for a specific ranch.

f. All licenses require written permission and shall be valid only on the specified property and transferrable with written permission to other private lands within the specified GMU. Written permission requirements for access on private property will follow the provisions found in 19.31.10 NMAC.

B. License restrictions Private land-only pronghorn hunts: Private land-only pronghorn licenses shall be restricted to the hunt dates, eligibility requirements or restrictions, sporting arms type, and bag limit that corresponds to the draw hunt code listed in Subsection A of Section 19.31.15.11 NMAC for the GMU where the private landowner's property lies. Private land-only pronghorn licenses shall be, listing the open GMUs or areas, eligibility requirements or restrictions, hunt dates, hunt codes, sporting arms type, number of licenses and bag limit shall be as indicated below and be unlimited, except the any legal sporting arms hunt in GMUs 4, 50 and 52 shall be limited to 15 licenses, or as otherwise provided in 19.31.15.8 NMAC, and available from any license vendor and the department's web site. These licenses are not valid for ranch-wide agreement properties as described in Subsection B of Section 19.31.15.10 NMAC. Private land-only pronghorn licenses are valid only on deeded private property where the licensee has written permission to hunt, and within the GMU or area allowed by hunt code, except ranch-wide agreement properties. Private land-only pronghorn licenses are not restricted to only one ranch or property. In those GMUs where there is no pronghorn draw hunt (GMUs 4, 14, 46, 48, 54, and 55), hunt dates, eligibility requirements or restrictions, sporting arms type, and bag limit will be:

C. Private land-only F-IM pronghorn hunts: The department will work with interested landowners with sufficient pronghorn populations to authorize F-IM hunts on private deeded land. Sporting arms type, hunt dates, eligibility requirements or restrictions and authorization numbers for private deeded land F-IM hunts will be negotiated to maintain appropriate harvest within the exterior boundaries of participating ranches.

D. Pronghorn hunt for injured service men and women: The department may annually issue up to 15 authorizations for hunting by injured service men and women on Melrose Air Force Range. The director shall determine the procedures for issuing the authorizations, and the dates for each hunt.
