Agenda Title: Revocations

1. Summary of Agenda Item

The Department will notify the Commission of the revocations or suspensions carried out pursuant to the Parental Responsibility Act, those who have failed to pay a penalty assessment citation within 30 days, those who have entered into a civil agreement or have a civil judgment, and those who have failed to comply with the Interstate Wildlife Violator Compact.

- 246 individuals certified by the Human Services Department as being out of compliance with the Parental Responsibility Act [40-5A-1 NMSA 1978] were suspended until in compliance.
- 386 individuals who failed to pay a penalty assessment citation within 30 days of the violation were suspended until they are in compliance.
- 1 individual who has entered into a civil agreement or has a civil judgment.

The Department will present the 2 individuals who meet established criteria for the revocation or suspension of their hunting, fishing, trapping, guiding, and outfitting privileges or other privileges or authorities granted by an agreement, license, or permit issued by the Department.

- 2 individuals accrued 20 or more points in a 3-year period. They were mailed a notice of contemplated action and did not request a hearing, and Department agreements were reached.

2. Background Information

Sections 17-1-14 and 17-3-34 NMSA 1978 authorize the Commission to revoke the hunting, fishing and trapping license privileges and the Outfitting and Guiding registration privileges of individuals for violations of Chapter 17 and Commission rules. Section 30-14-1 NMSA 1978 requires the Commission to revoke the privileges of individuals who commit Criminal Trespass while hunting, fishing, or trapping for a minimum of 3 years.

Under the Parental Responsibility Act (40-5A-1 NMSA 1978), the Commission is required to suspend the license privileges of obligors not in compliance with a court order for child support.

Commission Rule 19.31.2 NMAC outlines the procedures for administering all revocations and suspensions.

PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITY ACT

Pursuant to 19.31.2.23 NMAC, the Director suspended the license, permit, certificate, or registration and associated privileges of 246 individuals out of compliance with the PRA until they provide a certificate of compliance from the Human Services Department and have paid the reinstatement fee.

PENALTY ASESSEMENTS

Pursuant to 19.31.2.24 NMAC, the Director suspended the license, permit, certificate, or registration and associated privileges of 386 individuals who failed to pay penalty assessments within 30 days.

CIVIL ASESSEMENTS

Pursuant to 19.31.2.24 NMAC, the Director suspended the license, permit, certificate, or registration and associated privileges of 1 individual who was assessed a civil judgment or agreement and will be suspended until in compliance
