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GENERAL INFORMATION:

The Director's Amphibian and Reptile List shall be used by the Department as the bag limits for all purposes of take of amphibians and reptiles.

It shall be unlawful to exceed the bag limit of any species of amphibian or reptile listed on the Director's Amphibian and Reptile List for the current license year.

Note: any species of native, free-ranging amphibian or reptile not currently on the species list will be designated to have a bag limit per license year of five (5).

It is unlawful to take native, free-ranging amphibian and reptile species that are Federal or State listed as threatened or endangered.

Nonresidents must purchase and also have in their possession a nonresident hunting license listed in Section §17-3-13 NMSA 1978 required by law for the year in which the taking is done.

If utilizing public lands, a Habitat Stamp and Habitat Management and Access Validation (HMAV) should be purchased along with a non-game or game hunting license. Purchase online at wildlife.dgf.nm.gov.

Methods of Legal Take (*Only the following methods shall be used for the legal take of free-ranging, native amphibians and reptiles*):

- Collection from road surface
- Lizard lasso
- Snake grabbers and hooks
- Seines
- Cast nets
- Dip nets
- Field collection, including the use of hand-held flashlight or spotlight, provided the collector is not in possession of a firearm or other implement whereby any big game animal or domestic animal could be killed.

COMMERCIAL COLLECTING:

It is unlawful for any person to take free-ranging, native amphibians and reptiles in New Mexico for commercial purposes without purchasing and having in possession a valid Commercial Collecting Permit.

A Commercial Collecting Permit is required if you collect amphibians and reptiles for the purpose of sale, barter, or profit, OR are in possession of the bag limit of a species, or more than 50 of a species with unlimited take of wild-caught amphibians and reptiles (see Director's Amphibian and Reptile List).

The Commercial Collecting Permit is valid from April 1 through March 31 of the following calendar year and must be renewed prior to collecting. Each person who purchases a Commercial Collecting Permit is required to file an annual report on a standardized form approved by the Department.
