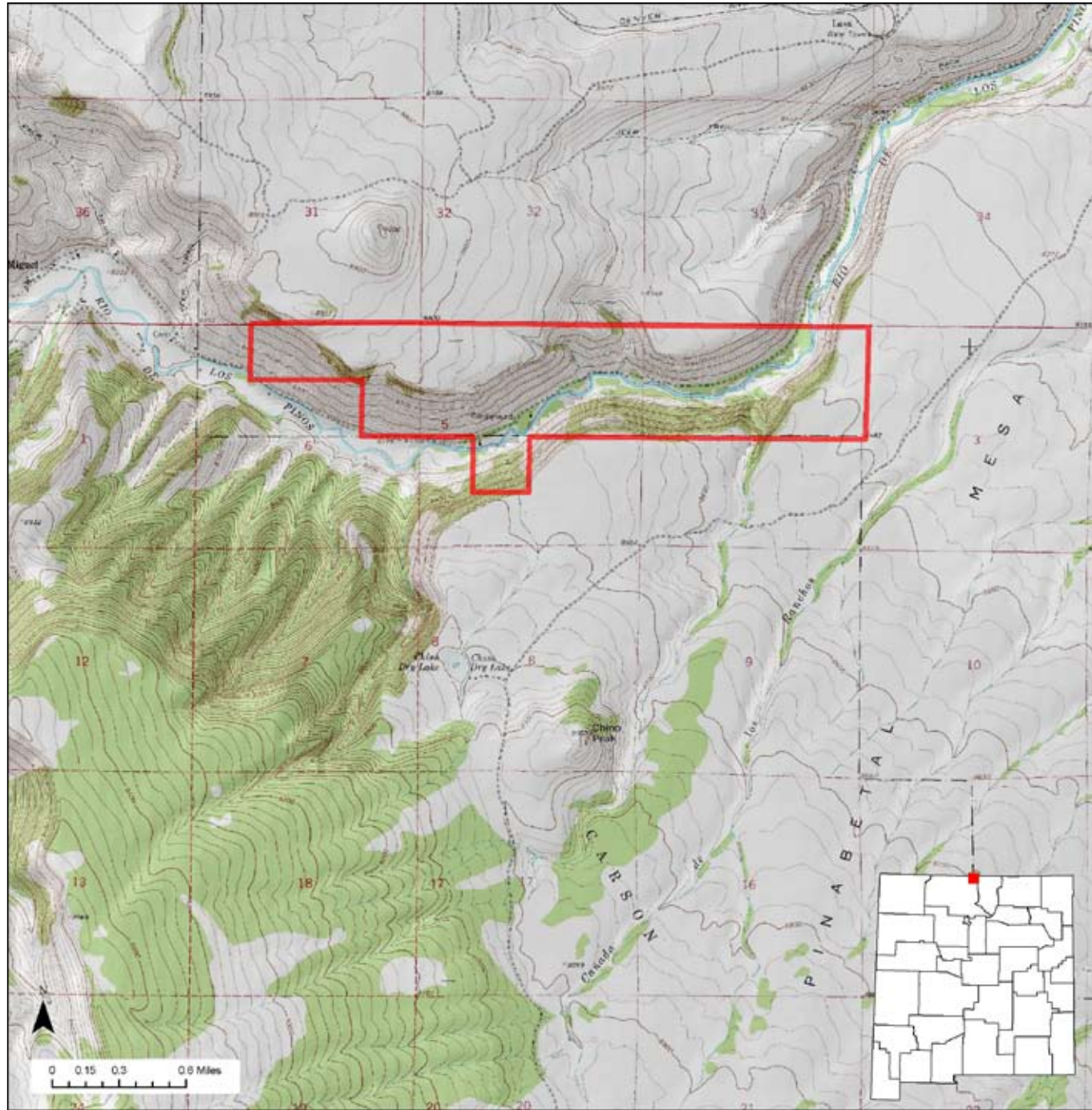




Rio de los Pinos Wildlife Area




Location: The Rio de los Pinos Wildlife Area is located just south of the Colorado border in northcentral New Mexico.

Total Acreage: 848 acres.

Purchase: Rio de los Pinos Wildlife Area was purchased in 1953 to provide fishing and recreational access.

Description: The Rio de los Pinos Wildlife Area contains 1.5 miles of river. The bottom land is covered in grassy meadows and cottonwoods.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Wildlife Viewing ✓ Photographing 	<p>Wildlife Viewing-Wildlife watchers may see various wildlife species year-round. Good binoculars are important. The best time to view wildlife is at dawn or dusk.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Access</p>	<p>Photographing-The best time to photograph wildlife is at dawn or dusk. A telephoto lens may be important.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Hiking ✓ Bicycling ✓ Horseback Riding 	<p>Hiking-Hiking is the best way to see wildlife year-round at the Rio de los Pinos Wildlife Area or other wildlife management areas.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Hunting and Fishing</p>	<p>Bicycling-Allowed year-round only on established roads.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Hunting ✓ Fishing 	<p>Horseback Riding-Allowed year-round.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Closures</p>	<p>Camping-Primitive camping is allowed year-round at the Rio de los Pinos Wildlife Area.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ No 	<p>Hunting-Allowed on nearby U.S. Forest Service and BLM lands.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Facilities</p>	<p>Fishing-Fishing is allowed year-round.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Rest rooms ✓ Primitive camping ✓ No drinking water 	<p>Closures-The Rio de los Pinos Wildlife Area is open year-round.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Fees</p>	<p>Facilities-The Rio de los Pinos Wildlife Area has rest rooms and primitive camping but no drinking water.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Yes 	<p>Fees-Hunters and anglers must have appropriate licenses and permits. Wildlife viewers, photographers, hikers, bicyclists, and horseback riders must have a current GAIN Permit and a Habitat Management and Access Validation.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Motorized Vehicles</p>	<p>Motorized Vehicles-Not allowed beyond roadway and parking areas.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Not allowed beyond the roadway and parking areas
