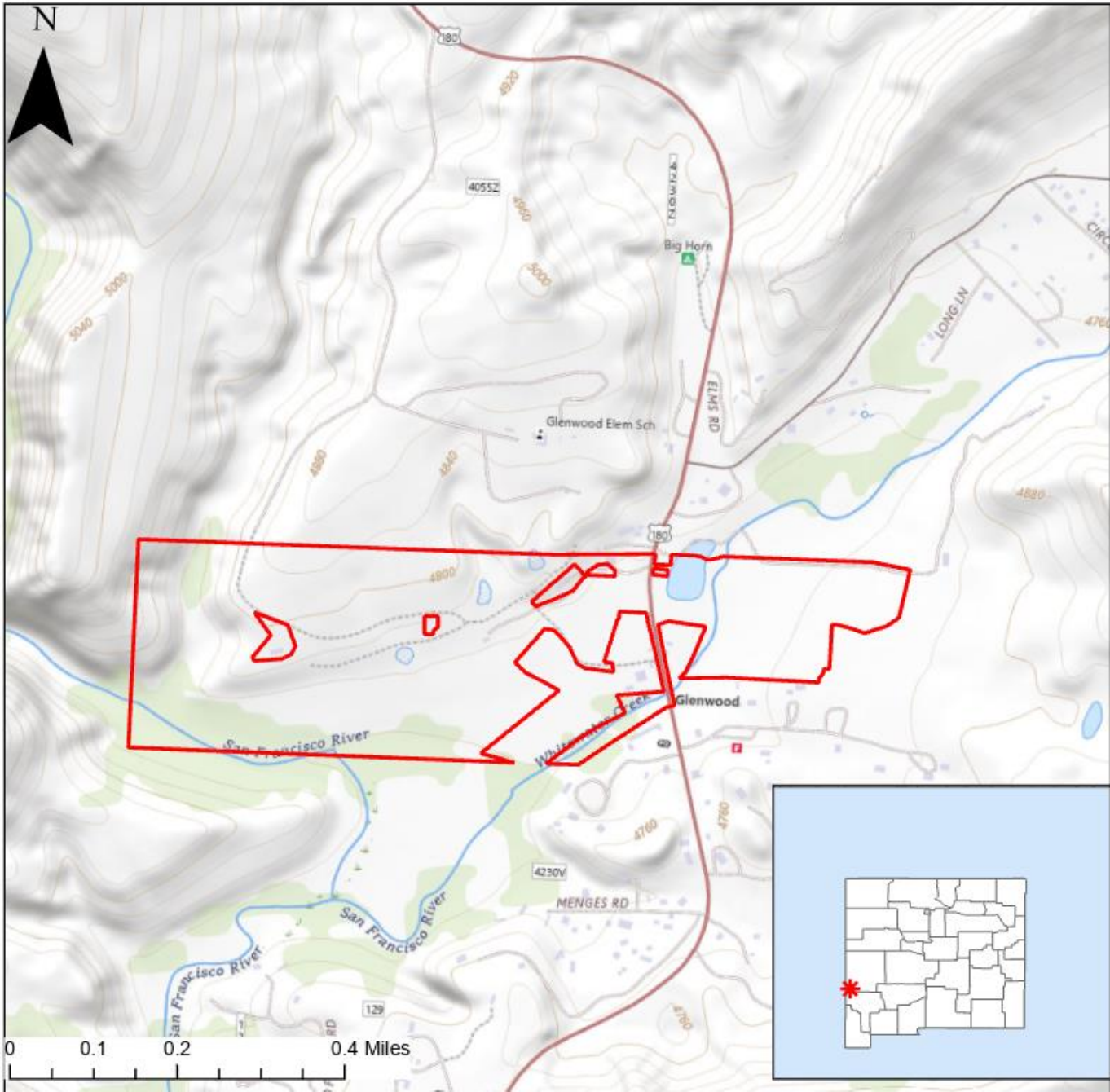




Glenwood-Allred Wildlife Management Area





Location: Glenwood/Allred Wildlife Area is located within the town of Glenwood in Grant County.

Total Acreage: 107 acres.

Purchase: This WMA was purchased to improve wildlife habitat and recreational opportunities while maintaining a viable water system for the Glenwood Hatchery.

Description: The property consists of various habitat types suitable for deer and javelina, as well as designated critical habitat for Loach Minnow, Narrow-headed Gartersnake, Southwestern Willow Flycatcher, Spikedace and Yellow-billed Cuckoo.

GAIN Activities	What to See, Do, and Learn
Wildlife Viewing	Wildlife Viewing -Wildlife watchers may see wildlife year-round. Good binoculars are important. The best time to view wildlife is at dawn or dusk.
Photographing	Photographing -The best time to photograph wildlife is at dawn or dusk.
<u>Access</u>	Hiking - Hiking is the best way to see wildlife at Glenwood/Allred Wildlife Area.
Hiking	Bicycling -Not allowed.
Horseback Riding	Horseback Riding -Allowed year-round but opportunities are extremely limited.
<u>Closures</u>	Camping - Camping and Campfires are not allowed.
No	Access -The Glenwood/Allred WMA is open from one half hour before sunrise until one half hour after sunset, year-round unless otherwise posted. No Trespassing.
<u>Facilities</u>	Facilities -There are no rest rooms, camp sites, or drinking water available at the Glenwood/Allred Wildlife Area.
No rest rooms	Fees -Wildlife viewers, photographers, hikers, and horseback riders must have a valid license or permit. See the Department's website www.wildlife.state.nm.us for more information.
No camp sites	Motorized Vehicles -Not allowed beyond parking area.
